Meanderings and Musings from Our Rector

Dear Beloved Community of Trinity,

Once again, I find myself writing to you long after the Trumpet deadline. True confessions: the reality is that I have a long history of “slipping my assignment under the door” before the bell tolls. (My apologies to Judy and Kelly, among others.) Yet, even as I scribe these meandering thoughts and ponder the midpoint of Lent, I wonder if I should try to give up procrastination for Lent, now three weeks late. Ha! Alas!

Yes, we have arrived at the midpoint with Laetare or Rose/Rejoice Sunday upon us. Speaking of procrastination, or the opposite thereof, I want to lift up for the prompt response of Barb Lowery to my request for rose-colored additions to our vestments and hangings. While I had hoped for simple rose-colored swatches of material to drape over our hangings, Barb rose to the challenge in quick order with her exquisite, quilted components, which will be a bright spot amidst the deep purple, a moment of lightness and joy amidst the pondering and penitence. (Gracious thanks, Barb!)

Procrastination, promptness, pondering, penitence, purple, pink and playfulness: this array of “p’s” makes for a challenging and rich mélange that is on par with where I spend most of my life ---- an odd balancing act of between, betwixt and becoming. In many ways, my hopes for my life and my Lenten journey might be summed up by a quotation from Brené Brown’s book, *The Gift of Imperfection*: “It is in the process of embracing our imperfections that we find our truest gifts: courage, compassion, and connection.”

Perhaps rather than giving up “procrastination,” I am charged with taking on and embracing my “imperfections.” What about you? Did you start your Lenten journey with aspirations that have not come to fruition? Or have you held tightly to your convictions and been fulfilled by the giving up or taking on of it all? Whatever your story or process may be, my hope is that Lent leads to authenticity, that is a new sense of beloved-ness, belonging and becoming the authentic people of God we were/are created and called to be.

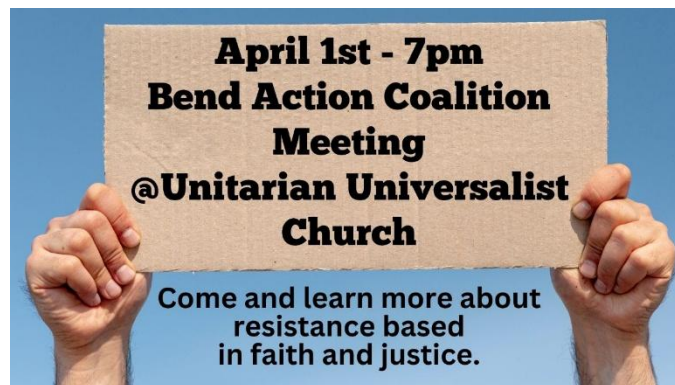
Again, leaning on Brené Brown, I share these words: “Authenticity is the daily practice of letting go of who we think we’re supposed to be and embracing who we are. Choosing authenticity means cultivating the courage to be imperfect, to set boundaries, and to allow ourselves to be vulnerable; exercising the compassion that comes from knowing that we are all made of strength and struggle; and nurturing the connection and sense of belonging that can only happen when we believe that we are enough. Authenticity demands Wholehearted living and loving—even when it’s hard, even when we’re wrestling with the shame and fear of not being good enough, and especially when the joy is so intense that we’re afraid to let ourselves feel it. Mindfully practicing authenticity during our most soul-searching struggles is how we invite grace, joy, and gratitude into our lives.”

Our Wednesdays in Lent aka “Soup and Stories” have focused on telling the history of Trinity and weaving our stories into the larger picture. Part of the overall aim is that we might see how our stories are intertwined and smattered with both joys and sorrows, successes and failures, struggles and grace – that we are all human, all imperfect and all in this together. And, again, out of that awareness grows the capacity and agency for us to be a people of “courage, compassion and connection,” to be instruments of “making a difference” and a transforming presence for one another and the world. Let us embrace our imperfections together!

Right now, these values are under threat. The dismantling of federal protections, the erosion of civil rights, and policies rooted in fear and scarcity demand a faithful response.

The United Methodist, Episcopal, Presbyterian, Evangelical Lutheran, and Unitarian Universalist congregations of Bend are forming the Bend Action Coalition to anchor our resistance in the teachings of our faiths and the work of justice. We'll begin with issues like land and housing, immigration, and civil rights — but our foundation is clear: Nobody is disposable. Love is non-negotiable. Faith takes action.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Can it already be April with Easter upon us? How has your Lent been transpiring? As of this writing, we have had one Wednesday Night Soup Supper which was fun, delicious and informative, and another awaits tomorrow. If you haven't had a chance to attend a Wednesday night supper, I highly recommend it, especially if you're new to the congregation as some very interesting history of Trinity is being shared. We'll have our Easter Vigil in the Trinity Sanctuary, while the Easter Sunday services will be as usual...8 AM at Trinity and 10 AM at St. Helens. I look forward to responding with the "A" word once again and being with you during this holiest of holidays! I'm sure there will be a delightful coffee hour on Easter Sunday, too!

Finally, our Vestry continues to be hard at work. We are focused on the organization of the Outreach committee; we are planning some maintenance and renovation of our facilities and continue to create and provide faith formation opportunities. We're also looking at some possible new signage to draw the public's eye toward Trinity. We would like to invite everyone to the Parish Workday and Palm Cross-making event on April 12th. 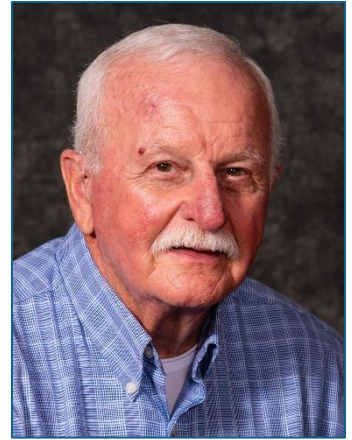

- **Lunch will be served after 1:00 PM**



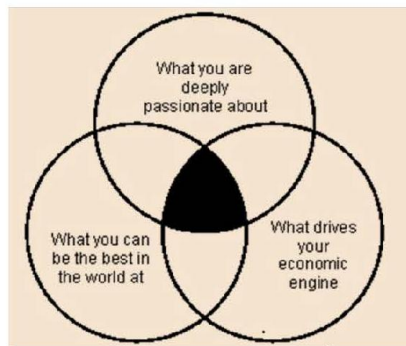
If you are unable to do the yard work and there is some cleaning you feel comfortable with please let us know.

May is K.I.D.S. Month! We are hoping to send 40-50 local underserved kids to Ascension School Camp in Cove, Oregon this summer. Previous campers are already asking, "Can I go to camp again this year?" We want to be able to say, "Yes!"

Our K.I.D.S. fundraising kicks off with a **Forum on Sunday, April 27th at 9AM** in Brooks Hall. Bob Moore, Project Coordinator for Central Oregon Partnerships for Youth (COPY) and Jenn Davis, Program Director for J Bar J's Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Oregon will speak about how K.I.D.S. grants have helped their client-kids.

June 6th from 5-7:30PM at On Tap in Bend (1424 NE Cushing Dr, Bend, OR 97701), come and enjoy music by the Doc Ryan Band, food trucks, a grassy area for kids and dogs, raffles and silent auction items. Get there early for a seat or bring your own comfy lawn chair.

Our goal is to raise \$20,000 so that our local youth can experience some "normal" kid activities. Overnight camp at Ascension School averages \$600 per camper and we want to have funds for extracurricular activities for those who can't be away from family that long. These "extra" funds pay for sports equipment, art lessons, rock climbing fees, horseback riding and much more. For example, having shoes for a sport enables a child to participate in that sport when the parent or guardian is challenged just to pay for food and shelter, never mind sports equipment.
