## How to Prepare for ICE Actions

1. Make a Written Plan Ahead of Time and share with Staff

2. Educate Your Staff about action to take and their rights:

Provide LUCE number and information on legal rights;

A worker can say, "I can't give you permission to enter. You must speak with my employer."

Workers should NOT interact with ICE agents. If ICE agents have questions or requests, workers should say nothing, or say, "You are not allowed to enter. Talk to my employer."

3. What Employers Should Do When ICE Arrives:

### For Public Areas

Anyone – including ICE agents – can enter public areas of your business without permission.

Public areas include a dining area in a restaurant; parking lot; lobby or waiting area.

Being in a public area does NOT give ICE the authority to stop, question, or arrest just anyone. This requires a valid judicial warrant (see below).

### For Private Areas

To show that some areas are private, mark them with a "Private" sign, keep the doors closed or locked, and have a policy that visitors and the public cannot enter those areas without permission.

Immigration agents can enter a private area ONLY IF they have a judicial warrant.

A judicial warrant must be signed by a judge and say "U.S. District Court" or a State Court at the top.

Without a judicial warrant, ICE agents need YOUR permission to enter private areas of your business.

If ICE agents try to enter a private area, you should say: "This is a private area. You cannot enter without a judicial warrant signed by a judge. Do you have a judicial warrant?"

If ICE agents tell you that they have a judicial warrant, ask for a copy and read it. The employer can accept the warrant but still decline to consent to the search.

Sometimes, ICE agents try to use an administrative warrant to enter. But an administrative warrant does NOT allow agents to enter private areas without your permission. Administrative warrants are not from a court. They say "Department of Homeland Security" and are on Forms I-200 or I-205.

A valid judicial warrant:

1. Is signed by a judge or magistrate judge;
2. States the correct company name and address of the premises to be searched;
3. Includes a specific time frame within which the search must be conducted;
4. Includes a description of the premises to be searched and a list of items or people to be seized.

If ICE arrives at your workplace:

**DO NOT:**

- > Physically impede the passage of federal agents;
- > Provide false information;
- > Help employees flee the premises;
- > Refuse entry to private areas if you are provided with a valid judicial warrant.

Also remember:

It is legal to photograph or record what happens and it can be helpful later on.

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!



We all have rights in the United States!

## Basic Rights

- Right to remain silent
  - Right to speak with a legal representative
  - Right to see a warrant
- Carry a [Know Your Rights card!](#)**

## Rights if Immigration Comes to your Home

- Do not open the door unless ICE has a warrant signed by a judge
- Do not answer any questions. You have the right to remain silent.
- Do not sign anything without consulting a legal representative.

## Family Preparedness

- Gather important documents
- Make plans for who will care for your children
- Register your child's birth with your country's government and apply for a passport for your child
- Update school contacts

## Getting Legal Help

- Only lawyers and accredited representatives can give you legal advice
- Notaries (notarios) are not authorized to give legal advice

## Rights when driving

- Stay in the car and place your hands on steering wheel
- Drivers must provide name and address, but do not need to answer questions about immigration status
- In MA, immigration status is not required to get a driver's license!
- **Never present false documents**

## Rights if Immigration Comes to your Work

- Right to remain silent
- Do not answer any questions or give officials any information about yourself
- You have the right to not line up

## Rights in Detention

- Right to remain silent
- Do not sign anything without consulting a legal representative
- Right to request release on bond.

- Los conductores deben proporcionar su nombre y dirección, pero no necesitan responder preguntas sobre su estatus migratorio
- En MA, no se requiere el estatus migratorio para obtener una licencia de conducir!
- **Nunca presente documentos falsos**

## Derechos si inmigración llega a su trabajo

- Derecho a permanecer en silencio
- No responder a ninguna pregunta ni dar a los funcionarios ninguna información sobre usted
- Tiene derecho a no ponerse en fila

## Derechos en detención

- Derecho a guardar silencio
- No firmar nada sin consultar a un representante legal
- Derecho a solicitar la libertad bajo fianza

- Somente advogados e representantes credenciados podem lhe dar orientação jurídica
- Notários não estão autorizados a dar orientação jurídica

## Direitos ao dirigir

- Permaneça no carro e coloque as mãos no volante
- Os motoristas devem fornecer nome e endereço, mas não precisam responder a perguntas sobre status de imigração
- Em MA, o status de imigração não é necessário para obter uma carteira de motorista!
- **Nunca apresente documentos falsos**

## Direitos se a imigração for ao seu trabalho

- Direito de permanecer em silêncio
- Não responda a nenhuma pergunta nem forneça aos oficiais nenhuma informação sobre você
- Você tem o direito de não entrar na fila

## Direitos na detenção

- Direito de permanecer em silêncio
- Não assine nada sem consultar um representante legal
- Direito de solicitar liberação sob fiança.

### What can I do if ICE is inside my home to make an arrest?

- Tell them if there are children or other vulnerable residents at home.
- Ask them to step outside unless they have a warrant signed by a judge.
- If they came inside without your permission, tell them “I do not consent to you being in my home. Please leave.”
- If ICE is arresting you, tell them if you have medical issues or need to arrange for childcare.

### What are my rights if I am being arrested by ICE?

- You have the right to remain silent. You have the right to speak to a lawyer.
- **DO NOT LIE.**
- You do NOT have to share any information about where you were born, what your immigration status is, or your criminal record. Ask to speak to a lawyer.
- You do NOT have to give them your consular documents or passport unless they have a warrant from a judge. You do not have to sign anything.

## **If You're Asked About Immigration Status**

### **(By local police enforcement)**

- You have the right to remain silent. You do not have to answer questions about where you were born, whether you're a US citizen, or how you entered the country.
- If you're not a US citizen and have valid immigration papers, you should show them
- Do not lie about your citizenship status or provide fake documentation.

## **If You're Stopped in Your Car**

- Upon request, show driver's license, registration and proof of insurance.
- Both drivers and passengers have the right to remain silent. If you're a passenger, you can ask if you're free to leave. If yes, silently leave.
- You may refuse to if an officer or immigration agent asks to search your car. However, if they believe your car contains evidence of a crime, they can search it without your consent.

## **Know Your Rights with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)**

### **(from the Immigrant Defense Project)**

#### **Who is at risk of being arrested by ICE?**

The people the Trump Administration announced ICE will initially focus on deporting include:

- people with pending criminal cases and/or prior criminal convictions;
- people with final orders of removal;
- people who have committed fraud or misrepresentation in applications to the government;
- people they believe pose a threat to public safety or national security

#### **People with legal status and prior convictions**

#### **Be aware! You may be a target even if:**

- Your conviction is from years ago;
- You didn't serve time in jail;
- Your case was minor or a misdemeanor;
- You've been an LPR for a long time; and/or all the other members of your family are US citizens.

## **Know Your Rights with ICE**

### **If officers come to my home, will I know they are from ICE?**

Not always! Beware: ICE agents often pretend to be police and say they want to talk to you about identity theft or an ongoing investigation.

### **Can ICE agents enter my home to arrest me?**

If ICE agents do not have a warrant signed by a judge, they cannot enter the home without permission from an adult. *Opening the door when they knock does not give them permission to enter your home.*

### **So, what do I do if officers are at my door?**

- Find out if they are from Department of Homeland Security or ICE.
- Try to stay calm. Be polite. Don't lie. Say "I don't want to talk to you right now."
- Politely ask to see a warrant signed by a judge and to slip it under the door. If they don't have one, decline to let them in.
- If they are looking for someone else, ask them to leave contact information. You don't have to tell them where to find the person and you should not lie.

**¿Qué puedo hacer si ICE está dentro de mi casa para hacer un arresto?**

- Dígame si hay niños u otros residentes vulnerables en casa.
- Pídales que salgan a menos que tengan una orden firmada por un juez.
- Si entraron sin su permiso, dígame "No consiento que esté en mi casa. Por favor, vete."
- Si ICE lo está arrestando, dígame si tiene problemas médicos o necesita organizar el cuidado de niños.

**¿Cuáles son mis derechos si estoy siendo arrestado por ICE?**

- Tienes derecho a guardar silencio.
- Tiene derecho a hablar con un abogado.
- **NO MIENTAS.**
- Usted NO tiene que compartir ninguna información sobre dónde nació, cuál es su estatus migratorio o su historial criminal. Pida hablar con un abogado.
- Usted NO tiene que darles sus documentos consulares o pasaporte a menos que tengan una orden de un juez. No tienes que firmar nada.

## Si se le pregunta sobre el estatus migratorio (Por policía local)

Tienes derecho a guardar silencio. No tienes que responder preguntas sobre dónde naciste, si eres ciudadano estadounidense o cómo entraste en el país.

Si usted no es ciudadano estadounidense y tiene documentos de inmigración válidos, debe mostrarles

No mentir sobre su estado de ciudadanía o proporcionar documentación falsa

## Si estás detenido en tu coche

Bajo petición, mostrar licencia de conducir, registro y prueba de seguro.

Tanto los conductores como los pasajeros tienen derecho a guardar silencio. Si eres pasajero, puedes preguntar si eres libre de irte. En caso afirmativo, váyanse en silencio.

Usted puede negarse a si un oficial o agente de inmigración pide registrar su auto. Sin embargo, si creen que su coche contiene evidencia de un crimen, pueden buscarlo sin su consentimiento.

## Conozca sus derechos con inmigración y control de aduanas (ICE)

(del Proyecto de Defensa de Inmigrantes)

### ¿Quién está en riesgo de ser arrestado por ICE?

Las personas que la Administración Trump anunció ICE se enfocarán inicialmente en la deportación incluyen:

- personas con casos penales pendientes y/o condenas penales previas;
- personas con órdenes finales de expulsión;
- personas que han cometido fraude o tergiversación en las solicitudes al gobierno;
- personas que creen que representan una amenaza para la seguridad pública o la seguridad nacional

**Personas con estatus legal y condenas previas ¡Sé consciente! Usted puede ser un objetivo incluso si:**

Su condena es de hace años;  
No cumpliste condena en la cárcel;  
Su caso fue menor o un delito menor;  
Has sido un LPR durante mucho tiempo;

y/o todos los demás miembros de su familia son ciudadanos estadounidenses

## Conozca sus derechos con ICE

Si los oficiales vienen a mi casa, ¿sabré que son de ICE?

¡No siempre! Cuidado: Los agentes de ICE a menudo fingen ser policías y dicen que quieren hablar con usted sobre el robo de identidad o una investigación en curso.

¿Pueden los agentes de ICE entrar en mi casa para arrestarme?

Si los agentes de ICE no tienen una orden firmada por un juez, no pueden entrar en la casa sin el permiso de un adulto. Abrir la puerta cuando llaman no les da permiso para entrar en su casa.

Entonces, ¿qué hago si los oficiales están en mi puerta?

- Averigua si son del Departamento de Seguridad Nacional o ICE.
- Trata de mantener la calma. Sé cortés. No mientas. Di "No quiero hablar contigo ahora mismo".
- Pide educadamente ver una orden firmada por un juez y deslizarla debajo de la puerta. Si no tienen uno, declina a dejarlos entrar.
- Si están buscando a otra persona, pídale que los dejen la información de contacto. No tienes que decirles dónde encontrar a la persona y no debes mentir.
