

Volunteer Opportunities – Season of COVID-19

Ushers

- Please arrive **20-30 minutes prior** to the service, making sure to **bring your own face mask**. If you do not have one, the Church Office has a supply of face masks that have been donated that you can select one from. **Be sure to wear both face masks and medical gloves for the full duration of the service**, there will be gloves provided for you at the Offering Table.
- Prior to the service, **please be sure that the Bathroom Hallway Door is propped open** and that there are a **minimum of 5 grey metal chairs placed 6 ft apart on the back deck** for parishioners who do not want to wear a mask.
- Greet all parishioners, being sure to keep your face mask and gloves on. If a guest arrives and **is not wearing a facemask**, kindly offer them a disposable mask found in the large upper right-hand cabinet of the narthex. **If they do not want to wear a mask** to attend the worship service inside the sanctuary, kindly **explain that there is seating on the back deck** where they will still be able to hear Fr. Jim's sermon.
- Show all masked parishioners to in any of the **appropriate rows marked for the service you are volunteering for**, explaining that **there needs to be two empty chairs between each group of parishioners**
- Have a seat on the very back row of chairs against the back wall and windows of the church, being sure to keep an eye out for any parishioners arriving late. **If parishioners arrive while the Sunday Readings are being read, please meet them in the narthex or outside of the church building and wait until the Readings have been read. Then quietly escort them to an appropriate row.**
- During the service, please take count of all present including **parishioners, guests, volunteers, staff, Altar Guild members and Fr. Jim himself**. There are **two blue slips** of paper that can be found on the small, wooden table attached to the back wall of the church between the windows. **Please record the attendance on these sheets and later put in the offering plate when you go to receive communion.**
- After The Lords Prayer has been read, **stand ready at the back of the church and wait for Fr. Jim and the Altar Guild to get ready to distribute communion. At that time, walk forward to the first row of parishioners instruct them to the “on-deck squares” marked on the outer aisle in blue tape on the floor**. Parishioners will then **alternate sides** as they go to receive communion in family groups and then **return to their seats through the middle aisle.**

After the Service

- Help guide parishioners out of the front, main church doors, where they are welcome to exchange The Peace out in the parking lot should they feel comfortable.
- Then turn all chairs on the inner and outer aisles to reflect proper seating for the next service. Locate a bottle of disinfectant that will be in the Coffee Hour Overpass to the kitchen. Lightly coat the chairs used from the prior service with the disinfectant, *including the backs of the chairs*, where some parishioners may have placed their hands. Once finished with this task, please place the bottles of disinfectant back in their proper place, in the Coffee Hour Overpass to the kitchen.
- After the 10:30 Service, volunteers are to lock the lower gate of the main parking lot, as well as the entrance and exit of over-flow parking lot across Saxon. If any cars remain in the over-flow parking lot, please be sure to let Fr. Jim or anyone on the Staff know that you were not able to lock the gates to the over-flow lot.

Readers

- Be sure to bring your own face mask to wear while reading the readings and during the rest of the service.
- When you arrive, please familiarize yourself with the lectern (that has been disinfected from prior use by the Altar Guild) and readings. Feel free to adjust the microphone height for your comfort.
- Please speak to Fr. Jim, letting him know that you are here and are the Reader for whichever service you have volunteered for.
- After the congregation reads the Gloria, Fr. Jim will then read the Collect for the Day that is found at the very top of your bulletin readings insert. After Fr. Jim and the congregation say “Amen”, Fr. Jim will then seat them, and you will proceed to the front of the church for your readings.
- Regardless of which service you are volunteering for – please read ALL of the readings, including: The Old Testament Reading, The Psalm (to be read in unison, or by half-verse), and The New Testament Reading.
- After each reading, please be sure to read the following prayers printed below each reading and then return to your seat.
