Equity Learners and Leaders,

It is with unresolved sadness and pain that I craft this message. Pain, for the sad realities that exist in the midst of a global pandemic. Sadness and pain, for “the huddled masses that yet yearn to breathe free.” Sadness and pain, for the bruised face of America that is repeatedly being displayed. Equity Learners and Leaders, I carry great sadness and pain about the resurgence of and continuous attacks against Asian Americans. The media stories narrating the trauma and suffering that my Asian sisters and brothers are carrying are quite unsettling.

These times are reminding me of our former Board Chair, Ms. Marny Xiong, a passionate and fearless warrior for equity. One of the last opportunities we shared was in connection with addressing the xenophobic and anti-Asian rhetoric that began last spring. Her comments at the April 21, 2020 Board of Education meeting ring and resonate clearly for me. Ms. Marny shared that as one of few AAPI Board members in Minnesota, many people, young people especially, reached out to her to share what they were experiencing. She stated how we have been here before, yet with different faces. Her words expressed the cancer of racism; the divide and conquer; and the us versus them tactics that are mobilized against positive collective change. Chair Marny Xiong reminded us of the impact of the 1882 Exclusion Act and its repeal sixty years later.

The executionary acts, displacement, and condemnation that our AAPI community continues to face is reprehensible. Will America’s bruised face ever heal? Will the huddled masses ever breathe freely? I can only learn and lead with a hope “that a change is gonna come.” I invite you to **STAY ENGAGED** while possibly **EXPERIENCING DISCOMFORT** as we participate and/or witness this battle of racial reckoning in America. As you choose your role, keep in mind, the children are watching. **ALL** of our children are watching.

Please know that The Office of Equity is committed to serving you in the midst of the pain, sadness, and suffering of this period of reckoning. ## K-5 Integrated Units

Last summer the Office of Equity and Social Studies Department worked with teachers to create [30 three-day units that integrate social studies and literacy](#). All units:

- are written specifically for K-5 distance learning
- include activities on SeeSaw, Schoology and Google docs
- are built around a children's book with diverse representation - all books available as multi-user e-books
- integrate standards from social studies, literacy and other content areas
- Identify culturally responsive instructional strategies and Teaching Tolerance social justice standards
- include Courageous Conversations Classrooms, tools teachers can use to develop themselves and their classrooms to engage in meaningful conversations with students

## Opportunity to Take Action

In 2010, state legislation was passed stating that educators must include the contributions of Minnesota American Indian tribes and communities in their instruction. Unfortunately, there was no plan, budget or accountability associated with it, and teachers have struggled to accommodate this requirement.
