Profiles

This week's edition of *Profiles* features Past Presidents Seymour Stein, Irving Ginzburg, Avraham Kleiman and David Grabel otherwise known as the ATCS Fab.

TCS: Did you ever picture yourself as a youngster someday being the President of a Shul? Seymour, back when you were serving KKK specials at the Noshery or Irving when you were a little boy in South Africa? Avraham, when you were touring

with the Rolling Stones and David when you were a rookie page caller at AISH in the early days.

TCS: Your biggest fear or concern in taking the post?

Irving: No, she just warned me that it would be harder than they were telling me.

David: My wife knew better and wondered why I would want a target on my back.

Seymour: Joelle was supportive but asked "don't you have a job?"

Avraham: Marcia completely supported the idea that there should be a president, I think she wasn't sure about me.

TCS: Have you fully paid her back yet for her support?

Avraham: I hope so.
