3rd Meal Question

Reuven was in desperate need of a kidney transplant to save his life. As he waited for a matching donor to become available, he was kept alive by dialysis machines.

He had heard that many other Israelis had flown to China for kidney operations, with successful results. He investigated the matter and was told that China follows all the standard medical and ethical procedures for transplants that are practiced by the top hospitals in the western world. The Chinese claimed that the organs were taken after death from willing donors who filled out an organ donor cards in their lifetime.

However, when he continued to ask around, he heard distressing reports to the contrary. Rumours circulated of secret prison cells in the basement of Chinese hospitals, where death-row convicts were kept having their organs harvested for transplant. The convicts were tested for compatibility, and their organs were taken as needed, leaving the convicts to die in the operation. Some said that such harvesting operations were widespread, operating in as many as thirty-five different Chinese hospitals. A doctor who fled from China claimed to have been involved in these transplants himself.

On the one hand, China seemed to be his only hope for a compatible kidney transplant. On the other hand, he was scared to be an accomplice to murder. Could he rely on the official claim of the Chinese government that the organs were taken only from an accident victim and the like, and leave the burden of guilt on their shoulders if they were lying? Or was it his ethical responsibility to suspect that the rumours to the contrary be true?

Even if the rumours were true, perhaps it was not his problem. The convicts had been sentenced to death by Chinese courts, and "*dina d'malchusa dina*" – the law of the land is the law." He did not make or enforce Chinese law, and the convict would be killed in any case, through no fault of his. On the other hand, perhaps by going for the transplant, he hastened the convict's death even by a few days, and was thus partner to murder.

What should he do? Find out this week at 3rd meal with Rabbi Rothman

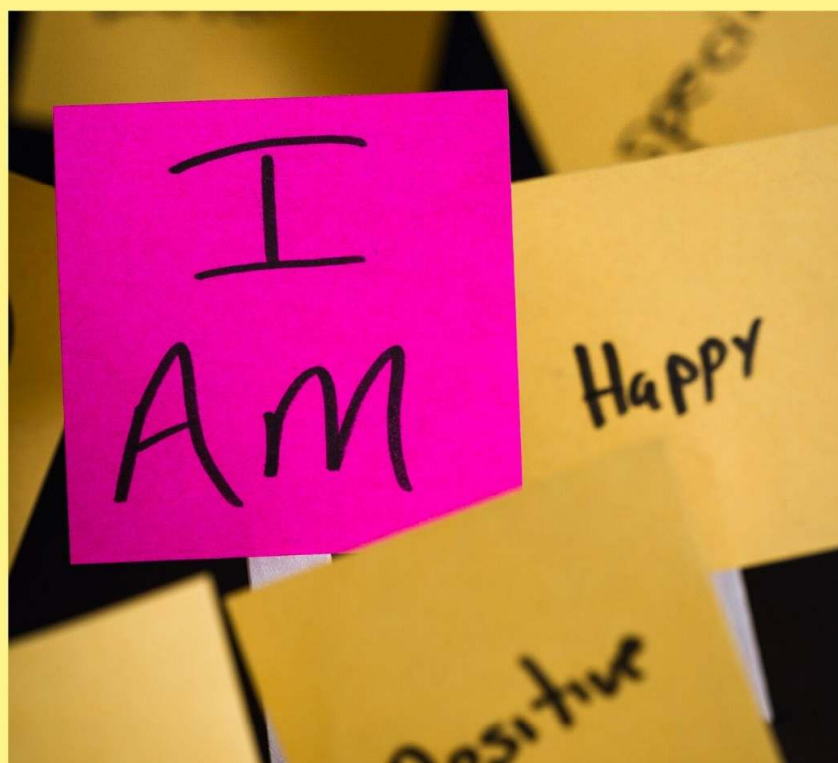
