Important Notice to Members

The UJA / Toronto Federation has issued a warning regarding a scam that has been attempted against an area Synagogue. Members and staff received an email supposedly from the Rabbi asking them to purchase some gift cards for the Rabbi to use for people in need. They are instructed to send the code numbers of the card to a specific email address belonging to the Rabbi. The Rabbi has NO knowledge of this!

These are SCAMMERS using a cloned email, that appears to have been sent from the Rabbi.

It should be known to all, the Rabbi and leadership of the ATCS will NOT directly email members, staff or friends of the Shul to ask them to purchase gift cards for the Shul. Please do not allow yourself to be tricked by these scammers.

3rd Meal Question

A taxi driver was stopped by a respectable – looking person in Tel Aviv, who asked for a ride to Tiveryah for an important business meeting. It would be a long ride and it was a hot summer day, and after a short while the passenger asked the driver to stop off at a gas station so he could buy a drink. The passenger got out and came back a few minutes later with two cans of cola, one for himself and one for the driver.

"I brought you one too," he said. "You must also be thirsty on such a hot day." The truth is that he was thirsty, but he was embarrassed to accept the gift.

"Don't feel bad," said the passenger. "Look, I already opened it for you. If you don't drink it, it will go to waste."


The driver thanked him and took a drink. It was the last thing he remembered before he woke up with his cab parked in a dark forest, and all the money in his possession gone. The passenger had put a knock – out drop in his cola, drove the car to a secluded location, and then robbed him and ran off. The thief must have had his eye on him, since he had just that day withdrawn a large sum of money to buy an apartment for his daughter who was a *kallah*.

"I have no doubt that the thief will get his just desserts, either in this world or the next," said the taxi driver. "I am also sure that my own loss – as painful as it was – was really Hashem's kindness."

Then he quoted the Alshich's commentary on the verse, "I saw something like an affliction to me," meaning that some harsh decree had been passed regarding my bodily health, but Hashem had mercy and transferred that decree "on the house" instead.

What bothered the taxi driver was rather the question of whether he should recite a *beracha achronah* on the cola he drank, since he was indeed thirsty when he drank it, and now felt satisfied. On the other hand, since the drink damaged him and caused him such great loss, and he would never have drunk it had he known what it contained – perhaps he should not recite a *beracha achronah*

A message from ATCS President Stuart Haber and Rabbi Avram Rothman

In the past few years it has become quite evident that society is changing. While just a short while ago it was hard to believe that Synagogues in Toronto would need security, now it is clear that it is irresponsible for any Jewish or religious institution in North America to not incorporate security measures to protect its members and guests.

On that basis, the ATCS Board created a Security Committee to evaluate and institute security measures to safeguard ATCS members and guests over Shabbat & Yom Tov.

A number of strategies to increase security have been implemented and there are a number of forthcoming initiatives including a secure gate for the southwest fence, security film for the windows, cameras and panic alarms.

The Security Team has met with Vaughan Police Services, the UJA Toronto Security Committee, B'nai Brith Security Leadership and private security companies. Based on professional feedback and the personal positions of many, the acquisition of an off duty armed police constable during religious services on Shabbat and Yom Tov is a reasonable though costly requirement to ensure the security that our community requires.

To date, the ATCS has been able to finance the various security updates and improvements through the Shul's budget, fundraising and an extremely modest government grant. The Board and the security committee have worked diligently to improve security without any direct cost to the membership.

However, this will be forced to change if the ATCS retains the services of an armed constable.

The cost of an off-duty armed Police Constable (on Shabbat & holidays) over the course of a year will exceed tens of thousands of dollars.

On this basis, the Board turns to you, our membership, to invest in the next level of security by contributing, annually, a tax receiptable \$200 per member unit (couple or family) and \$100 per single member, for police services.

The ATCS cannot afford to take this next step without the universal participation of its congregants. This is a one-time cost we would levy annually to ensure we have the necessary funds to commit to an annual armed presence outside our Shul.

This decision is an important one and, in this case, member financial commitments will determine whether the ATCS can concretize this new strategy or not.

The above letter was distributed to the membership of the Shul this past Saturday evening. To date, we have forty families committed to partnering financially in acquiring an armed guard for Shabbat & holidays. As noted in the letter, we need about one hundred and twenty families to be a part of this effort for it to work.

Please respond as noted in the letter if you are willing to join the partnership enabling the Board to acquire the armed guard.

Your participation will make a difference.

We believe this to be a prudent decision, providing the needed security to our members and guests. Kindly respond as soon as is possible.
