Ellie is our official farm greeter and her favorite place to spend the day is "guarding" the entrance to the butcher shop. This picture isn't glamorous, nor is the work that goes on inside this building. The building is old, but functional and lately it's been bursting at the seams. This week we will process just over 1,000 pounds of ground meats and sausages and for us that is a feat. In comparison, these meat plants that are being shut down

around the country are processing literally tons of meat per shift. At one time I calculated that it would take us 120 years to produce the same amount of product one plant produces in a week! In our shop we have room to practice social distancing. We would know instantly if someone was feeling ill. We've continually talked about how to handle things if one of us contracts the virus. We are professionals, we are working vigorously to serve you and we take your food safety extremely seriously.
