GRACE School	Award/Recognition
GRACE- wide	GRACE CHOIR Through the support of the Diocese Foundation, GRACE initiated a GRACE-wide Liturgical Choir to sign at our GRACE parishes during masses. Six performances are planned between December 2018-May 2019.

GRACE-wide	GRACE ACCREDITATION GRACE completed a two year system-wide accreditation through WRISSA with site visits occurring in November 2018. GRACE was the first system to complete the system-wide accreditation through WRISSA.
GRACE-wide	GRACE TEACHER COMPENSATION In a continual effort to focus on teacher compensation, all GRACE teachers were issued a teacher bonus on top of their annual salary in November 2018 made possible through a

	generous private donation.
GRACE-wide (cont.)	WISCONSIN DOJ SCHOOL SAFETY GRANT AWARD of \$153,990.00 for GRACE Schools (June 2018). The grant is being used to enhance training and improve building security at all nine GRACE schools. The upgrades include safety film to a number of school entrances, new communication systems, lock replacements, and additional security cameras and security system.
Holy Family School	Holy Family School has begun weekly meetings with the school Counselor, Supportive Consultant, and Hispanic Home-School Liaison called the Student Intervention Team (SIT). The format for these meetings is based on the work of respected author and speaker, Mike Mattos, in the book <i>Simplifying RtI</i> . During these meetings, student concerns ranging from academic, behavioral and social-emotional are discussed and solutions are found. The SIT also reviews student screening assessment data and directs Tier III interventions, as well as providing coaching support for teachers who are looking for means to support their Tier I and Tier II students.
Holy Family School	Holy Family School has established a new Leadership Structure for the 2018-19 school year which clearly outlines structures and responsibilities to ensure Holy Family's long-term vitality in the Green Bay Catholic community.

St. Bernard School	<p>PLTW - SCIENCE</p> <p>SBS has fully unrolled Project Lead the Way science curriculum from Kindergarten - 5th grades and has a corresponding VEX IQ robotics team.</p>
St. Bernard School	<p>PRAYER FOR ATHLETICS</p> <p>The Site Advisory Council and the Athletic Club worked together to implement the use of a school prayer at the start of each sporting event that is held in the SBS gym. This prayer hangs on a banner in the gym, facing the spectators. SBS team captains lead the opposing team and all of the spectators in the recitation of the prayer at the beginning of each game keeping Christ at the center of all that we do.</p>
Holy Cross	<p>Holy Cross School-Going Green & Healthy Project</p> <p>Holy Cross received the Green Bay Packer Foundation Grant for \$3,000 , Cellcom grant for \$1,000, Shopko grant for \$500 and Meemic grant for \$300 plus numerous donations for the start of their outdoor learning classroom/lab. This outdoor learning space will involve students and staff in educational and STREAM opportunities. The space will include an interactive prayer garden. The students and community will collaboratively work together to design and build the space. The Going Green & Healthy program consist of: Community involvement, energy usage awareness, environmental health, environmental & sustainability education, health & wellness, recycling & waste management, school site project and water awareness. The program is centered around respect for the gifts in our environment that God has created for us.</p>
Our Lady of Lourdes	<p>Preschool room renovation and program expansion occurred in 2018 to grow services and programs for 3 and 4 year olds. Significant dollars were raised and also private donations to refresh this preschool space.</p>
