Welcome Back to School Students and Families

Chicago Public Schools (CPS) announced that 84.2 percent of students at district schools attended remote learning classes on the first day of school on Tuesday, September 8, 2020.

According to CPS, "While challenges related to COVID-19 impacted the district's first day attendance rate compared to prior years, intensive outreach efforts over the summer led to an overwhelming majority of students logging on during the first day of remote learning." Beginning the week of

September 14th, some schools also began to implement an At-Home Learning Ambassador Strategy, which is a measure to get in touch with students who schools have not been able to reach through other efforts.

As part of this strategy, school principals utilize security officers who are provisioned for home visits to provide outreach to students who have not responded to any of the other outreach efforts. Security officers have built relationships with their students and are well suited to serve in this role. All CPS

security officers were trained on how to conduct home visits in preparation for returning to school. –

Being an Active Member in Public Safety

Since the call for Beat Facilitators was put out we've seen a tremendous response from active community members who are stepping up to not only own their community issues, but also own the resolutions.

The role of a beat facilitator is to help keep the beat community meeting focused on the problem-solving process, assist in publicizing and reminding other about meetings and assist in following up with problem-solving activities by community members.

This may sound like a mighty feat; however it is very important that police

officers join forces with community members to help with outreach and implementation. After all, community members are the eyes and ears for law enforcement and know intimately what their community concerns are.

Beat Meetings are essential to the problem solving process. The intention of these meetings is to host a collaborative environment for citizens and police. These meetings are facilitated by residents and police together.

Currently, beat meetings are held once a month for each sector. In the near future, each beat will host its own

meeting, giving residents the opportunity to discuss their issues on a regular basis. This means that each beat will need citizen representation.

Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, and Wisconsin.
