Joanne Simon Tailele wrote her first short story at the age of ten. For fifty years, writing was her private release for her soul. In 2010, she accepted the NANOWRIMO challenge to write a novel in thirty days. Two years of edits later, it was print worthy. She has spent the last ten years exploring the craft of writing, studying with some of the best in the industry such as Lisa Cron, Jennie Nash, Betty Larson and Donald Maass.

When describing her writing style, Ms. Tailele states, “I consider my stories ‘moral fiction,’ a phrase coined from my favorite author, Jodi Picoult. My brand has evolved to be mother-daughter stories that show strong character arcs that test the resilience of women of all ages.”

Ms. Tailele has published three Women’s Fiction, two biographies and a children’s book. She is the current president of Marco Island Writers Inc. and owner of Simon Publishing LLC, an editorial service that specializes in developmental editing.
