

In Colorado, Governor Jared Polis announced the launch of the Urban Landscape Water Conservation Task Force, with the participation of the Sonoran Institute's Growing Water Smart Director, Waverly Klaw! The Task Force will work to identify practical ways to advance outdoor water conservation through state policy and local initiatives, to meet pressing challenges of urban conservation in Colorado. In addition, the Sonoran Institute will host communities for our Growing Water Smart workshops in Phoenix (March 6-8, 2023), Estes Park Colorado (May 8-10, 2023), and San Bernadino Valley California (June 14-16, 2023).

In Arizona, the Sonoran Institute's Santa Cruz River team led a trash pickup that brought out more than 100 people and collected more than 7,000 pounds of trash! The event set the stage for our upcoming Santa Cruz River Research Days on April 20 and 21, 2023, and will be offered in both English and Spanish, online and in-person. "Raise All Voices in Conservation" is this year's theme and will headline speakers such as Navajo Water Project Executive Director, Emma Robbins and Tucson Council Member, Lane Santa Cruz.

In the Delta, our diverse environmental team is reaching out to the local community to celebrate the restoration of the Colorado River Delta and its connection to the sea. Our "Family Saturdays" at the 700-acre Laguna Grande conservation area have connected nearly 26,000 people with the river.
