Youth Leadership Class Looks Back at Blount County

Learning about Blount County's history was the objective for the Youth Leadership Blount Class of 2017 in October. The day-long event was entitled "Exploring Our Community's History and Heritage." I

A major highlight of the trip was a hayride tour narrated by Bernard Myers who had once been a resident of Cades Cove.

Following the hayride, students were provided a delicious picnic lunch by the Knoxville Area Association of Realtors, Maryville Offices.

The next stop on the journey was the Little River Railroad and Lumber Company Museum. Students learned that Col. W.B. Townsend founded the company and brought it to the Great



Smoky Mountains in 1901. The company built over 150 miles of railroads through the Smokies and sawed over 560 million board feet of timber. Students saw a logging skidder and the 70-ton Shay engine.

Traveling back to Maryville, students visited the Thompson-Brown House and Cades Cove Museum. Museum Assistant

Director Richard Anderson led students through the house identifying donated artifacts from the residents of the Cove.

Being exposed to Blount County's history and heritage gave the Youth Leadership Blount Class a better understanding of those who have provided our community with such a strong heritage.

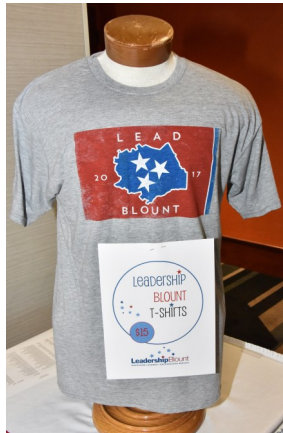
