Project Scope and Benefits

The Three Creeks Confluence Riparian Restoration and Enhancement project involves the restoration of 200 feet of the combined convergence of three of Salt Lake City's underground creeks – Red Butte, Emigration, and Parley's Creeks – and the Jordan River.

Benefits include:

1. Creating a gateway to the Jordan River for nearby community anchor institutions, schools, and the surrounding neighborhood.
2. Enhancing the ecological value of the site and reactivating the neglected area
3. Diversifying active transportation and recreation opportunities.
4. Expanding green infrastructure solutions to water quality impairments.
