Written on the Heart – A Reflection (Devo 2)

You were never an afterthought to God. Long before you were born into a family, culture, or story, you were written onto the heart of your Creator. Scripture tells us that our days were known before one came to be (Read Psalm 139), and that God has engraved us on His hands (Read Isaiah 49:16). You are deeply remembered.

But God doesn't stop at knowing you—He desires to transform you. Through Christ, God writes His truth not on tablets of stone but on human hearts (Jeremiah 31:33). His goal has always been inner renewal, not outward performance.
