8th Grade High School Admission Process

- High School applications for Chicago Public Schools will open on September 16-2019 at 9:00 am and close on December 12-2019
- activate your child's application account as soon as possible..it only takes a few minutes
- It allows you to create your family profile and view the programs to which your child is eligible to apply
- important tips.. enter name and address of parent/guardian with whom the student resides
- **Extremely** important because- address provided will be used for determining tiers, proximity boundaries, and attendance

High School Admission Process Continued

It is important that you follow the high school application pathway when activating your account. When asked if the student is applying to the 9th grade for fall 2019, make sure you select **YES** on this screen.

If your student attended a Chicago public school in the 2018-19 school year, you will be asked to enter their Activation Code

The Activation Code letter was sent home with your child at the end of the 2018-19 school year.

If you do not have your child's **Activation Codes** email Ms. Allegretti at amallegrett@cps.edu she will have access to the student's Activation Codes on Monday September 16, 2019, Feel free to set up an appointment with Ms. Allegretti to discuss your child's options for high school.
