Trout Creek Ranch Shared Use Campsite


In December 2023 our club was approached by the owner of Trout Creek Ranch. Five years ago our club along with four other groups signed a lease to use some private land to build an ATV and shared use campsite. ATVBC was involved with some grant money and many volunteers built a three sided structure, level tent pads, installed an outhouse and erected signage near the Kettle Valley Rail trail access. None of the other four groups/clubs could be reached or were interested so our SVR ATV club has solely renewed this same lease for the next five years. It was either that or have to remove all the improvements which would have been such a waste. Cost was \$1 per year and ATVBC has covered the liability insurance needed.



Going forward our club will have a work party day at the site as well as occasional visits for any maintenance required. After a recent winter visit it appears some weeding, brushing, painting, fence repair, FireSmarting, rut filling and raking are needed. Doesn't that sound like everyone's Spring Cleanup list for around your own yard? We need to amend the two info signs as we are the sole club contact now.

We are applying for a Trail Development and Maintenance grant from ATVBC to help with costs and should hear by April 30 if we are successful. Once the snow melts and the mud firms up we will set a date. Let us know if you are able/willing to join us for the day. We can ride out or drive there with our hand tools and supplies. Add a bbq lunch and it should be a productive day! Probably mid May or early June.

BC Trails Day, Saturday, June 1, 2024


