WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Up to 30 youth who will complete 5th or 6th grade this June can participate, alongside adult and older youth advisors. This year, we will be renting vans with consistent team leader/drivers, so parents are not required to volunteer. We hope this makes things simpler for you! Parents are still invited to serve alongside their children if desired. Friends who do not already attend LOPC are welcome, so please extend the invitation!

WHAT WILL WE DO?

Each day, we will travel in teams of 5 youth and 1 adult to a local (East Bay) LOPC mission partner location and serve in a variety of ways. Youth will become acquainted with some of the difficulties faced by people living right here in Contra Costa County and the many ways in which we can share God's love within our own community! Our dream is that this week will inspire youth to serve and love others throughout life.
