One Parkland High School survivor proclaimed, “We know what we want. We want gun reform, we want common sense gun laws, we want stronger mental health checks and background checks to work in conjunction. We want a better age limit. We want privatized selling to be completely reformed so you can't just walk into a building with \$130 and walk out with an automatic weapon.”
