### Arctic National Wildlife Refuge – Public Comment Opportunity

The Department of the Interior is preparing an Environmental Impact Statement to enable oil and gas leasing in the Coastal Plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. This notice is the beginning of a 60-day public comment period that will run through June 19, 2018. The [National Religious Partnership for the Environment](#) (NRPE) is encouraging the faith community to urge the Department of the Interior not to allow oil and gas activities on the Coastal Plain and protect God's creation and the Gwich'in people. ### Poor People's Campaign

The [Poor People's Campaign](#) is a 40-day "fusion" of direct nonviolent action of the poor, clergy and advocates that began on May 14. Campaign organizers point out that 50 years after King's assassination, systemic poverty, systemic racism, ecological devastation, the war economy, and Christian nationalism still persist. The campaign intends to bring these "moral failures" back to the center of public discourse. The theme for week 3 (May 27-June 2) is *Militarism and the Proliferation of Gun Violence*. The theme for week 4 (June 3-9) is *The Right to Health and a Healthy Planet: Ecological Devastation and Health Care*. [Learn more/get involved](#).



### New Vatican Document on Markets and Ethics

*Considerations for an Ethical Discernment Regarding Some Aspects of the Present Economic-Financial System* was approved by Pope Francis and released May 17. Reinforcing Catholic Social Teaching principles, the document reminds us that every economic activity has a moral and ethical dimension.

Everything from where a family chooses to invest its savings to where a multinational corporation declares its tax residence – are ethical decisions. "No profit is in fact legitimate when it falls short of the objective of the integral promotion of the human person, the universal destination of goods, and the preferential option for the poor." ## Juneteenth (6/19)

Juneteenth celebrates the end of slavery in the United States. On June 19, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas and announced the end of the civil war and the end of slavery. Although the Emancipation Proclamation came 2½ years earlier on January 1, 1863, and many slave owners continued to hold their slaves captive after the announcement, Juneteenth became a [symbolic date](#) representing African American freedom. How might we recognize Juneteenth in our culture today?


## World Refugee Day (6/20)

Today, there are over 22.5 million refugees, all hoping to find a safe community to welcome them. Canadians are responding to this need by [converting college dorms in Toronto into housing](#) for asylum seekers. Contrarily, in the United States, the Trump administration has set an all-time low refugee admissions goal, and will most likely fail to meet it. Since President Trump took office, more than 27,000 people have crossed the border into Canada seeking

asylum due to his administration's anti-immigrant policies. Please remember to participate in the SSND advocacy campaign to urge the administration to [Welcome More Refugees](#), because, in the words of UN Secretary-General *António Guterres*, "This is not about sharing a burden. It is about sharing a global responsibility, based not only on the broad idea of our common humanity but also on the very specific obligations of international law. The root problems are war and hatred, not people who flee; refugees are among the first victims of terrorism."
