

The Human Face of Our Climate Crisis



We are not going to get out of crises like climate or COVID-19 by hunkering down in individualism but only by "being many together", by encounter and dialogue and cooperation." Environmental Racism - United States

Over the past several decades, a growing body of research and empirical evidence has acknowledged that communities of color in the United States have born a disproportionate share of environmental and health

risks. Race, in the United States, is a predictor of dangerous levels of exposure to many environmental hazards such as lead poisoning, water pollution, toxic air, polluted landfills, and waste incineration plants. Canada's Supreme Court Rules Carbon Tax is Constitutional

Canada's Supreme Court ruled that the federal government's carbon tax law was constitutional because reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions is a matter of national concern, and the law is focused on that narrow purpose while still giving provinces the ability to legislate their own solutions. "The evidence clearly shows that establishing minimum national standards of GHG price stringency to reduce GHG emissions is of concern to Canada as a whole," the majority decision stated. "This matter is critical to our response to an existential threat to human life in Canada and around the world. . . . Climate change is real. It is caused by greenhouse gas emissions resulting from human activities and it poses a grave threat to humanity's future." [Learn more](#).



The concept of carbon pricing has been widely endorsed by economists, and according to the World Bank, some form of it has been carried out or is in development in 64 countries, either through direct taxes on fossil fuels or through cap-and-trade programs. [Learn more](#).

Earth Day (4/22)



Racism, Migration and Climate



Laudato Si' +5: See, Judge, Act

This film revisits the 2015 Papal Encyclical *Laudato Si'* with an update on the global climate crisis as well as an exploration of the impact of the loss of biodiversity and the emergence of COVID-19. Following the three step see, judge, act methodology from Catholic Social Teaching, the film explores the issues of Water, Global Warming and Loss of Biodiversity with Fr. Joshtrom Kureethadam, a cosmologist in Rome, Leonardo Boff, well known Liberation Theologian in Brazil and Canadian activists like Maude Barlow and Catherine Abreu. The film is designed as an educational primer for parishes, high school and university programs concerned with the Global Climate Crisis.

Immigration

In the United States, the Biden Administration's efforts

to recognize the humanity of migrant people offers hope to those who have been desperate to find a place to live in peace, and this seems to be contributing to an increase in the number of migrants seeking entry. In February, border patrol agents encountered more than [100,000 migrants](#) who

crossed the border without documentation—this is the highest recorded number since 2019. Many of these migrants are children without a legal guardian present. Health and Human Services/Administration for Children and Families has asked Catholic Charities to take the lead on providing care and accompaniment of thousands of unaccompanied children at the southern border. House Passes Immigration-Related Bills

On March 18, the U.S. House of Representatives [passed](#) two bills that would create a pathway to citizenship for individuals who came to the United States as children, Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) and Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders, and migrant farmworkers. If passed by the Senate, the [Dream and Promise Act of 2021](#) and the [Farm Workforce Modernization Act of 2021](#) would provide a pathway to citizenship for approximately 5 million people. The USCCB released a [statement](#) welcoming the action from the House and urging "swift Senate action." Let your voice be heard! Racial Justice & Workplace Equity Scorecards

As You Sow has released two S&P500 scorecards — one assessing companies on racial justice and the other on workplace equity disclosures. The data includes 22 key performance indicators on racial justice and 31 key

performance indicators on workplace diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) disclosure. "The only way to end corporate complicity in systemic racism is to confront it head-on," said Olivia Knight, As You Sow's racial justice initiative coordinator. "Our goal in releasing the racial justice scorecard is to provide a helping hand to get companies on the path to end systemic racism, starting

As many as [250 new laws have been proposed](#) in 43 states to limit mail, early in-person and Election Day voting. Safeguarding elections is one thing. Putting up unnecessary barriers to voting that disproportionately impacts the poor, elderly, and communities of color, is another. Thankfully, there's something we can do. The U.S. House of Representatives recently passed the *For the People Act* - a once in a generation democracy reform bill that would protect and expand our right to vote, end partisan and racial gerrymandering, get dark money out of politics, and restore transparency and accountability in our government. The [Responsum from the Vatican](#) regarding the question of the blessing of the unions of persons of the same sex has sent shock waves through the Catholic and non-Catholic world. Many have assumed Pope Francis' openness to gay unions based on a [2014 interview](#) in which he said that secular states could seek to "justify civil unions to regulate various situations of coexistence, driven by the demand to regulate economic aspects among people, such as ensuring health care." Therefore, it has been understandably confusing, if not shocking, to hear in the words "God does not and cannot bless sin," the Vatican's unequivocal moral assessment of LGBTQ relationships. For

The Day of Silence is GLSEN's annual day of action to spread awareness about the effects of the bullying and harassment of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning (LGBTQ) students. In the United States, students take a day-long vow of silence to symbolically represent the silencing of LGBTQ students. This year the day will be observed on Friday, April 23. Urge Congress to Address Hate in America

In March 2020 at the start of the coronavirus pandemic, we witnessed an alarming spike in the spread of disinformation about and harassment of the Asian-American community. A year later, crimes targeting Asians continue to soar.

According to the Center for the Study of Hate and Extremism, [anti-Asian hate rose by nearly 150% since March of 2020](#) On Tuesday, March 16, 2021, in Atlanta, a gunman killed eight people, including six Asian-American women. Take Action to Help Prevent Gun Violence

The recent mass shootings in Georgia and Colorado left a total of eighteen people dead. As Bishop Mark Seitz has stated previously, "The never-ending mass shootings leave us feeling dazed, wounded, fearful and helpless."

Certainly something can be done to help curtail these shootings. Recently, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2021 (H.R. 8), which would close current loopholes that allow people to purchase guns in private sales and at gun shows without undergoing a
