
[Laudato Si' Contemplative Training \(6/2-7/1\)](#)

"Only One Earth" was the slogan for the first United Nations Conference on the Human Environment, held in Stockholm in 1972. This put sustainable development on the global agenda and led to the establishment of World Environment Day. Fifty years later, Sweden is hosting *Stockholm+50* June 2-3. This year's meeting,

commemorating the first environmental conference, will address the intertwined crises of the state of our planet and extreme inequality among people and societies. Without action, exposure to air pollution beyond safe guidelines will increase by 50 per cent within the decade and plastic waste flowing into aquatic ecosystems will nearly triple by 2040. 

Good News - Cutting Air Pollution Would Save Thousands of Lives Annually

Eliminating air pollution caused by burning fossil fuels would prevent more than 50,000 premature deaths and provide more than \$600 billion in health benefits in the United States alone, every year, according to a [new study](#) by University of Wisconsin-Madison researchers. Unlike reports that emphasize the daunting costs of climate action, this one stressed the advantages of taking measures to reduce pollution. “Shifting to clean energy sources can provide enormous benefit for public health in the near term while mitigating climate change in the longer term,” said Nicholas A. Mailloux, lead author of the study. [Learn more](#).

Ecological Spirituality & Human Dignity

These issues of human dignity – those who are poor, those who are trapped in child labor, those who are migrants around the world – are intimately linked to the call for ecological spirituality in *Laudato Si'*. Pope Francis writes, “The current global situation engenders a feeling of instability and uncertainty, which in turn becomes ‘a seedbed for collective selfishness’. When people become self-centred and self-

enclosed, their greed increases. The emptier a person's heart is, the more he or she needs things to buy, own and consume. It becomes almost impossible to accept the limits imposed by reality. In this horizon, a genuine sense of the common good also disappears. As these attitudes become more widespread, social norms are respected only to the extent that they do not clash with personal needs. So our concern cannot be limited merely to the threat of extreme weather events, but must also extend to the catastrophic consequences of social unrest. Obsession with a consumerist lifestyle, above all when few people are capable of maintaining it, can only lead to violence and mutual destruction.“ (#204)

World Day Against Child Labor (6/12)

Did you know (according to [UNICEF](#)) that the number of children in child labor has risen to 160 million worldwide – an increase of 8.4 million children in the last four years? The agriculture sector accounts for 70% of children in child labor, followed by 20% in services and 10% in industry. Child labor is more prevalent among boys than girls at every age but when 21 hours per week of household chores are taken into account, the gender gap in child labor narrows. 



DACA 10 Year Anniversary

June 15 is the 10th anniversary of DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals), a policy that protects young people (who meet the criteria) who entered the United States unlawfully as children from deportation. The program does not grant them official legal status or a pathway to citizenship, but it does allow them to apply for a driver's license (in some states), secure a work authorization, and a social security number. [Learn more](#). Over the last decade, more than 830,000 young people have been protected from deportation under DACA. It is an occasion to celebrate, even as the effort to secure permanent protections continues.

Last spring the House passed the Dream and Promise Act, legislation that would provide protection from deportation and an opportunity to obtain permanent legal status in the U.S., but the Senate has yet to take action. Dismantling Racism - Replacement Theory & White Supremacy

[Racially motivated violence](#) continues to terrorize Black and Indigenous People of Color. White supremacist ideology such as found in "Replacement theory" is gaining popularity in the United States. Replacement theory claims that "white people are losing economic, cultural, and political power to Black people and other people of color." To further our

Juneteenth (6/19)

Also known as Emancipation Day, Juneteenth Independence Day, and Freedom Day, Juneteenth is a portmanteau word for June and nineteenth. It commemorates the date (June 19, 1865) when Union General Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas, to inform enslaved African-Americans of their freedom and that the Civil War had ended. Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States – it became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021. [Learn more](#). World Refugee Day (6/20)

Whoever, wherever, whenever – everyone has the right to seek safety. **Whoever** they are, people forced to flee should be treated with dignity. It is non-negotiable: seeking safety is a human right. **Wherever** they come from, people forced to flee should be welcomed.

Whenever people are forced to flee, they have a right to be protected. Whatever the threat – war, violence, persecution – everyone deserves protection. Everyone has a right to be safe. ([UNHCR/USA](#))

World Refugee Day celebrates the strength and courage of people who have been forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution. It is an occasion to build empathy and understanding for their plight and to recognize their resilience in rebuilding their lives. 


Number of mass shootings

of Aggression (6/4)


It is a sad reality that in situations where armed conflict breaks out, it is often the children who are most affected. The purpose of the day is to acknowledge the pain suffered by children who are the victims of aggression. This day affirms the UN's commitment to protect the rights of children.

Its work is guided by the Convention on the Rights of the Child, the most rapidly and widely ratified international human rights treaty in history, but a treaty the United States has not yet ratified. Catholic Peacebuilding Conference (6/20-23)

The Catholic Peacebuilding Network is planning an international virtual conference for June 20-23, 2022. It is titled "Catholic Peacebuilding in Times of Crisis: Hope for a Wounded World." This conference will convene a wide range of Catholic peacebuilders – Church leaders, scholars, peacebuilding specialists and other practitioners – addressing the need for an integral and integrated approach to peace, development, and ecology because the cry of war's victims, the cry of the poor, and the cry of the earth rise as one (Laudato Si', no. 49). Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons

The First Meeting of States Parties (1MSP) to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) is scheduled to take place from 21-23 June 2022 in Vienna, Austria. [Learn more](#). To commemorate the occasion, an interfaith statement has been drafted and
