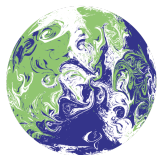

1 – Talking about COP26

What is COP26?

COP26 is the 2021 United Nations annual climate change conference. COP stands for Conference of the Parties. Parties are the signatories of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) – a treaty agreed in 1994 which has 197 Parties (196 countries and the EU). The 2021 conference, hosted by the UK, together with our partners Italy, in Glasgow, will be the 26th meeting of the Parties, which is why it's called COP26.

United Nations climate change conferences are among the largest international meetings in the world. The negotiations between governments are complex and involve officials from every country in the world as well as representatives from civil society, Indigenous Peoples and the global news media.

What happens at a COP?

Activity at a COP takes place in two different zones – the Blue Zone and the Green Zone.

The Blue Zone is for people registered with the UN body tasked with coordinating the global response to the threat of climate change – the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). In the Blue Zone you might be part of a national delegation, work for the United Nations and related organisations & agencies or be a member of the media or observer organisation.

In the Blue Zone, delegates from countries meet for both formal negotiations and informal consultations. They may also take part in meetings with other delegations to clarify their position and interests with the aim of reaching agreement or overcoming a negotiating deadlock. The UNFCCC will also host a range of events, including technical briefings, to support the negotiations process.

The Green Zone is for the general public. There will be a wide range of events, including workshops, art exhibitions and installations, as well as presentations, demonstrations of technology and musical performances for everyone to attend.



Together for our Planet

Together for our Planet is the government communications partnership campaign to promote and build engagement with COP26 across the UK. Through activations and partnerships we will build momentum towards COP26, building awareness and encouraging and stimulating dialogue on climate action and participation in the run up to COP26.

How is faith represented at a COP?

The Interfaith Liaison Committee (ILC) to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) was established during the Conference of the Parties (COP) in December 2013 to support the informal gathering of faith-based organisations (FBOs) that have actively engaged in UNFCCC processes since its beginnings.

FBOs have continuously engaged with the UNFCCC, making sure that the ethical, spiritual and moral dimensions of climate change issues are considered and integrated in inter-governmental climate negotiations and decision-making, as well as highlighting practical responses to the climate crisis undertaken by faith and spiritual actors.

The ILC was established as a Special Group under the UNFCCC as a network to assist this informal group of active FBOs. The ILC also works as a platform for FBOs with the aim of facilitating a dialogue and action on climate change between FBOs. The ILC meets during the COP and regularly online to collaborate on faith advocacy for climate ambition, embracing all the pillars of the UNFCCC and of the Paris Agreement: mitigation, adaptation, loss and damage and finance. Every year before the COP the ILC organises a Talanoa Interfaith Dialogue together with local faith-groups. The next one will take place on October 31st 2021 in Glasgow.

The ILC provides spiritual support to participants, including negotiators, during the COPs, encouraging prayer and meditation for all involved in each COP- both at the summit and from people of faith supporting the COP from all over the world.

The ILC advocates to ensure that the ethical, spiritual and moral dimensions of the climate emergency are not ignored during the negotiations.

A pivotal year for our climate

Special role of Faith, Religion and Belief groups on climate action

Representing over 80% of the world's population, faith, religion and belief groups have a unique perspective on climate change – in protecting the planet and supporting those on the front line of climate change – and a reach into communities around the world.

Faith leaders played a key role in building momentum for COP21 in 2015, for example with Pope Francis's encyclical letter [Laudato Si](#), the [Lambeth Declaration](#), the [Islamic Declaration on Climate Change](#), and contributions to the [UN 2030 Agenda](#). Five years on, religious leaders can play a similar role.

Other useful explanations

What is net zero?

Net zero means finding a balance between the greenhouse gases that an individual or organisation puts into the atmosphere, and those that are 'taken out'. The first step to achieve this is to reduce your emissions.

In other words, it's making sure that for all the gases emitted, you are removing the same amount from the atmosphere, making yourself carbon 'neutral'.

Achieving net zero is necessary if we are to tackle climate change and protect people, the planet and our natural world.

The UK has set a target of being net zero by 2050.



What does 'net zero' mean for me?

The first step to becoming net zero is to avoid emitting greenhouse gases in the first place. This could mean using less energy at school, walking or cycling and reducing your food waste.

The second step is to find ways to neutralise or 'offset' any remaining emissions that can't be avoided, as it's impossible to reduce emissions completely. Offsetting can be done in a variety of ways, including planting trees (which absorb excess greenhouse gases from the atmosphere).

28-31 October	Conference of Youth (COY16) - The UK COP26 Presidency is endorsing YOUNGO's sixteenth Conference of Youth event known as COY16. YOUNGO is the official youth constituency to the UNFCCC and has been hosting global youth conferences ahead of the last 15 COPs.

	The Conference of Youth is a key moment in the youth climate activism calendar and will bring together young people from across the world to discuss key climate change issues culminating in a declaration.
30 Sept – 3 Oct	Pre-COP26 – a preparatory meeting for COP26, bringing together ministers from a representative group of countries to discuss and exchange views on key political aspects of the negotiations, to find solutions to outstanding issues and set the tone for COP26.
4 October	Faith and Science: Towards COP26 – The British and Italian Embassies to the Holy See, and the Holy See itself, are inviting faith leaders and some prominent scientists to an event on 4 October in Rome to give a lead on climate change.
1 Sept to 4 Oct	Season of Creation – An annual ecumenical event, the Season of Creation runs from 1 September to 4 October each year, bringing together thousands of Christians on six continents for a time of restoration and hope and to discover new ways to care for creation. This year's theme is 'A home for all? Renewing the Oikos of God.'
31 Oct – 7 Nov	Scottish Interfaith Week – a week to celebrate Scotland's religious diversity. This year the theme is <i>Together for Our Planet</i> and will focus on spreading climate awareness.
30–31 Oct	G20 Leaders Summit – The G20 brings together the world's major economies to address shared challenges. It will focus on recovering from the pandemic and addressing climate change to ensure an inclusive and sustainable economic recovery
31 Oct – 12 Nov	COP26 summit in Glasgow





Participation ideas for Faith, Religion and Belief Groups

Looking for ways to get involved with climate change and COP26? You can use the build up to COP26 to highlight what Faith, Religion and Belief Groups are doing individually and collectively to tackle climate change.

Here are some ideas for climate-related local activities, potential visits and case studies.

CAMPAIGNS:

Climate Justice for All

Climate Justice for all is a climate focused, youth-led, global campaign which seeks to mobilise the Methodist family on issues of climate justice.

Coalition of Churches

The Climate Sunday initiative is calling on all local churches across Great Britain & Ireland to hold a climate-focused service on any Sunday before COP26. So far over 1,000 churches have joined in, could your church add its voice this year?

Faith for Earth Initiative

The goal of Faith for Earth is to strategically engage with faith-based organizations and partner with them to collectively achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and fulfill the objectives of the 2030 Agenda.

Faith for Earth has three main goals: to inspire and empower faith organizations and their leaders to advocate for protecting the environment, to green faith-based organizations' investments and assets to support the implementation of SDGs, and to provide them with knowledge and networks to enable their leaders to effectively communicate with decision-makers and the public.

Faith for the climate

Make COP Count is an informal group of representatives from different faith communities chaired by Faith for the Climate working together on advocacy, hospitality and action ahead of COP26. We believe the global response to the climate crisis must be rooted in justice – we see action on climate finance as essential to this.



ACTIONS:

Climate Initiatives Platform

A UN Environment Programme led portal which collects, shares and tracks information on international cooperative climate initiatives driven by non-state actors. They have recently created a 'Faith for Earth Initiative' where faith-based organizations can register their contributions and initiatives. Eco Church

Working in partnership with The Board of Deputies of British Jews, EcoSynagogue promotes environmental sustainability and engagement across the Jewish Community. EcoSynagogue's primary aim is to engage all Synagogues to register for, and participate in the Environmental Audit.

Faith Invest

Faith Invest is an international nonprofit organisation that empowers faith groups to invest in line with their beliefs and values. Their aim is to support the rapidly developing movement of faiths actively using their investments to create a better world – for people and planet.

Relay to COP26

The Young Christian Climate Network is an action-focused community of young Christians in the UK aged 18-30. The YCCN is doing a relay to COP26 and are looking for people who would like to get involved along the route to Glasgow.





World Resources Institute - Faith And Sustainability Initiative

WRI's Faith and Sustainability initiative supports existing and new faith-based sustainability projects and enables faith-based communities to build capacity for community-level solutions. Faith-based organizations have the potential and influence to undertake timely, informed, science-based and coordinated action that can reduce climate change.

4. Make a commitment to reduce paper use
5. Using and promoting the use of green energy

Promise To The Planet

We are working with the Scouts and WWF to run a campaign called [Promise To The Planet](#), which is aimed at engaging youth audiences in climate action in 2021. 57 million Scouts will lead hands-on activities to reduce climate change and urge world leaders to commit to ambitious targets and policies. Promise To The Planet is a global, environmental, social action campaign open to all young people and adults, whether they're currently involved with Scouts or not.

Hosted by teachers, sports clubs, artists, community groups, places of worship, builders, and anyone who cares about climate change, these will range from bike trials to litter picks, business promotions to concerts, and everything in between. 3 – #OneStepGreener Climate Leaders

Meet the UK's #OneStepGreener Climate Leaders

All over the UK, everyday people are doing their part to tackle climate change – in unexpected ways. They're not politicians, or activists, just people who live life with the planet in mind.

The below section describes what the #OneStepGreener Climate Leaders campaign is all about and how faith, religion and belief groups can get involved.

What makes a #OneStepGreener Climate Leader?

It's not just the familiar faces leading the way on climate change. Everyday people are going about their lives in quietly revolutionary ways – helping cut carbon emissions and make the UK and the wider world a greener place. We know faith, religious and belief groups have a passionate care for protecting people and planet, and are leading exemplary community action.

We're doing better than we might think at tackling this crisis – driven not just by politicians and activists, but by individuals, community leaders and businesses doing what's right. Regular people are going One Step Greener and making positive environmental choices, every day.

Perhaps it's a place of worship that's going above and beyond in greening their communal areas. Or a spiritual community that's trying to go zero carbon. Or a small business that's making the switch to low-carbon energy.

The UK's #OneStepGreener Climate Leaders instinctively see the wider benefits of doing these things – that a greener way of life means a healthier population, more jobs and a sustainable future for us all.

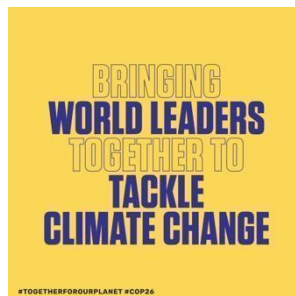
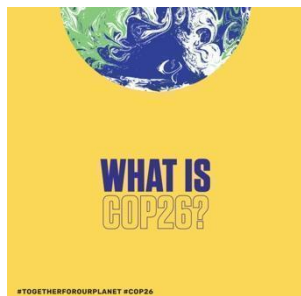

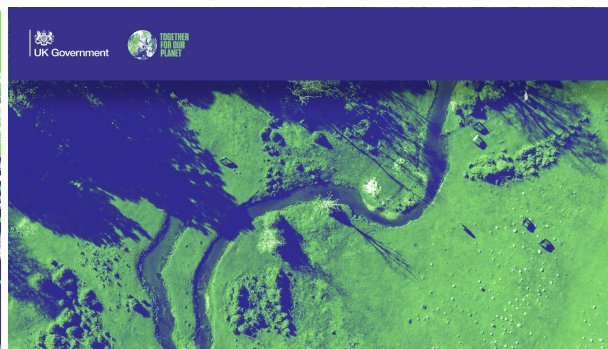
