However he says "it is great to be able to share positive examples across the country" as we are doing here in PEI. He specifically touted Patient Medical Homes, and how we</p>

He and the CFPC are continuing to promote the National Prescription for Primary Care Renewal, working on reducing the administrative burden, and continuing to invest in MDs and learners.</p> <p>Dr. Allan introduced himself and reports that he "really wants family medicine the prosper" and is continuing to work towards this.</p>
Special Guest Report, 13:10	Dr Kath Stringer, Department Head of Dalhousie Family Medicine	<p>Dr. Stringer reported that 51% of the class of 2024 at Dalhousie matched to family medicine, as opposed to 21% in 2018. Charlottetown was fully matched. They have increased residency seats by 20 in the last 2 years in the Maritimes. She acknowledges capacity for learners in the Maritimes and Dalhousie is continuing to work on curriculum reform.</p>
Special test report, 13:15	Honourable Minister of Health Mark McLane	<p>Mr. McLean acknowledged Family Doctor Day is happening in May. He recounted the ongoing "We Specialize in You" campaign to promote family doctors and called family doctors "trained collaborators."</p>
