SCHELLER EARLY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

The Lisa Jane Scheller Technology Scholarship will support eligible high school students in the **Early College** program from Allentown, Catasauqua Area, East Penn, Northern Lehigh, Northwestern Lehigh, Parkland, Salisbury Township, Southern Lehigh and Whitehall-Coplay School Districts, as well as Tamaqua High School, beginning in the fall 2020.

BUCKNELL SCHOLARS

Suliarys Contreras (Parkland High School) and Christian Gould (Jim Thorpe High School) successfully completed the Bucknell Community College 2019 summer program and have returned to LCCC to complete their associate degrees.

GRADUATE OUTCOMES

93% of 2018 graduates who responded to the survey are employed and/or continuing their education.

WOMEN'S SOFTBALL CHAMPS

LCCC women's softball team **earned District F** and **Region XIX championships** for the **second year in a row**, advancing to the national championship where they ended the season in **fifth place nationally**.

GRANTS

LCCC's **SHINE** After School Program received a 21st Century Community Learning Centers \$2.6 million grant for programs in Carbon and Schuylkill counties.

The college and Allentown School District kicked off their Early College partnership in August announcing a \$250,000 grant from the **Century Fund**, which supports 120 students.

Through a grant from the National Security Agency and the National Science Foundation, the college offered a **cybersecurity summer camp** for teachers who represented East Penn, Palmerton, Catasauqua Area, Allentown, Panther Valley, Jim Thorpe Area and Northern Lehigh
School Districts. Teacher in the Workplace grants provided an opportunity for teachers from Allentown, Salisbury Township and Whitehall-Coplay to visit B. Braun, Lutron, Mack Trucks, Coca Cola and Ocean Spray, as well as LCCC to learn how to build employability skills.

The college received a **\$15,000** grant from The Provident Bank Foundation to support the SEED Program Scholarships for Students with Disabilities. SEED offers coaching, peer support, and planning to help students with disabilities succeed in college.
