PIMIL's Virtual Fundraising in July – We are working diligently to achieve our fundraising goal virtually, of \$20,000 of this year because of the “new norm”. The July event is when we receive the majority of the funds that PIMIL needs to match, beyond, the sponsors’ donations in order to sponsor current students like **Musu Sando**, and new students. A Liberian Rice Bread Recipe



Yield: 8 x 12-inch bread

This rice bread is the typical recipe used by the Liberian housewife. It is not too sweet, can be used as a coffee cake or as a bread, and stays moist for a full week.

In a 4 quart bowl:

Combine: 2 cups CREAM OF RICE (cereal)

3 cups MASHED BANANAS (6 to 8 ripe bananas)

1/2 cup VEGETABLE OIL

4 Tbs. SUGAR

1/2 tsp. NUTMEG

1 tsp. SALT

1 cup WATER

1 tsp. BAKING SODA.

Stir until thoroughly blended.

Bake in a well-greased 8 x 12-inch rectangular or 9-inch round cake pan at 400° for 30 minutes.

Test with a toothpick (when it comes out dry, bread is done)
