













A Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) is a disciplined approach to collecting, analyzing and using local data and information to identify opportunities to improve the health and well-being of community residents. The CHNA process and CHNA document identifies areas of concern and leads to the development of action plans to improve health for individuals and the community at large. The process is done every three years and the completed CHNA serves as the basis for prioritizing the community's health needs, and culminates in planning to meet those needs.
