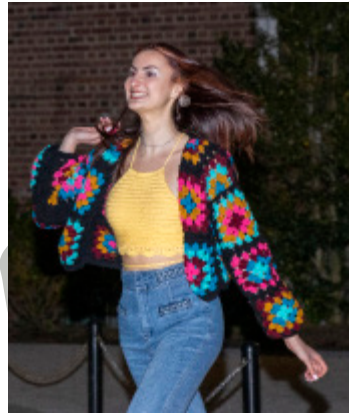
Lotus Magazine Hosts Fashion Show to Celebrate Tenth Issue

Caroline Voigt's line, CVPJs, offers the opportunity to wear comfy clothes to work — and still look professional.

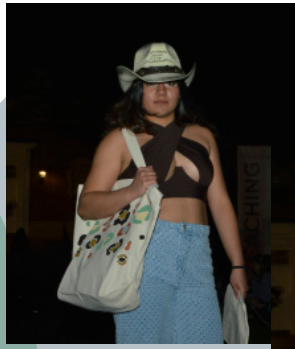
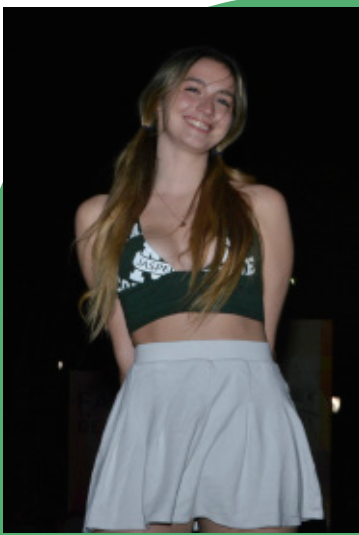


Regina Ricardo spends her spare time making colorful crocheted clothes.

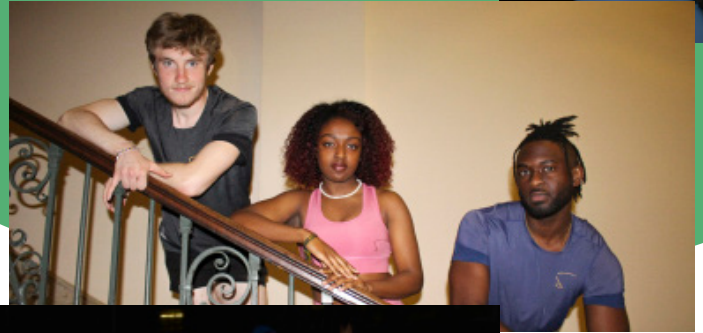
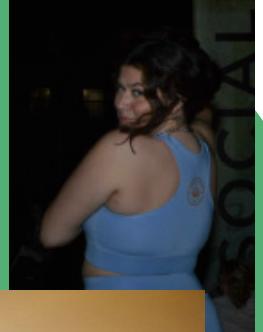




Juliana Tronconi paints custom tote bags that are for sale on her Instagram @totedbyjuliana!
