
*Dear SVPC Family,*


Where is the online catalog? Two ways to get there:


1. Vote online here: [svpc.us/favorite\\_hymns](http://svpc.us/favorite_hymns)

Expenses for May nearly matched the budget.






## Summer Community *Potluck* Dinners
