On October 30 we will celebrate SVPC's 60th anniversary. Al Mendoza and Kelly Shaver help us look back on God's blessings and faithfulness over these six decades.

Our family went 'church shopping' in 1966. Pastor **Bruce Coleman** was in charge and toward the end of that service he asked us to read together the Apostles' Creed. That was a very touching prayer to me. We soon decided to join the church. My wife, **Dorie**, joined the Chancel Choir and attended Women's Bible Studies.

In 1985 I was assigned to work overseas.

I was in the 4th grade when SVPC introduced the BLAST church school program, and I still remember my first rotation in Loaves and Fishes where we had the chance to taste foods common in Biblical times, including currants, which I enjoyed, and capers, which I definitely did not. During my time in SVPC's youth groups FLASH and CLUE, I was able to go on five mission

When we returned in 1993, the church had a new Senior Pastor, **Steve Harrington**. Dorie became a Stephen Minister. She also conducted the Cherub Choir. Four of our grandchildren sang in that choir and participated in many other youth programs including CARAVAN. I attended the Tuesday morning Bible Study led by Steve who was very caring and shared his knowledge with us in ways that were easy to understand.

In 1976, under the leadership of Bruce, SVPC built Life's Garden to provide housing for senior citizens. I was on the Board of Directors. Dorie and I moved there in 2001. After fifteen years, with the impetus of a major remodel, our Life's Garden era will soon come to an end.

Little did I know that Bruce's sermon in 1966 would affect Dorie, myself, our children, their spouses and our grandchildren in such meaningful ways over the next fifty years. Bruce baptized my youngest child and performed the marriages of both our daughters. Steve baptized four of our grandchildren and sadly, he and his wife, Nancy, performed the memorial service for our daughter, Valerie, who lost her bout with cancer in 2013. We are so grateful to be part this wonderful Christian community—for all the opportunities to grow our relationships with God and for the support during the most difficult of times.

trips, six wilderness/ski trips, and two youth retreats. Those opportunities were exciting, challenging, and, at times, life changing. I'm now a BLAST shepherd and a CLUE advisor, and I've seen the hard work and sacrifices it takes to provide all of the amazing opportunities for our children and youth.

The summer prior to my senior year of high school, I went on CARAVAN (SVPC's high school mission trip) to Los Angeles. I had given up on believing in God at that point in my life, and I was actively resistant to any attempts to convince me otherwise. During the Intersections service the evening that we returned, I experienced an incredible moment of transformation and reconciliation with God that changed my life forever. I realized that God had been there all along, in my fellow students, in our advisors, and in the church family waiting for me to come home.

SVPC nurtured me and taught me about God, and when I was an angry high school student who told everyone who would listen that I didn't believe in God, the church told me that it was ok and that I was welcome regardless. When I stood in front of the congregation a week after that LA CARAVAN and professed my rediscovery of God's grace, the church rejoiced with me and has walked along side me ever since.



Announcing a bit of a change... Director of Family Ministries



The latest SVPC news includes the promotion of **Carol Heath** to the Director of Family Ministries. Carol will still have direct and primary oversight over the Children's Ministry program, but will now supervise the Youth Director and have broad oversight over programs that impact families with children and youth. We are working on how to bring what were two

distinct but related ministry areas into a more comprehensive and unified vision for families. It likely means there will be a Family Ministry Team that holds things that currently overlap between the two ministry areas (i.e., Safe Church and Special Needs Ministry). This new combo ministry area will also facilitate collaboration and coordination of things like ministry calendar/events, parenting support, training, and communication. The Youth Director will still have full responsibility and accountability for the middle and high school program.

Carol is uniquely qualified for this role. Not only does she have extensive experience with creating, sustaining, and growing quality programs for children and their families, she has worked with youth staff over the years as a respected peer and partner in ministry. Her passion for families with kids of all ages, her amazing mentoring and leadership skills as well as her love of bringing others to Christ make this a great next step for our vanguard ministries.

The Book of James

Wednesdays, November 2, 9, 16, 30, and December 7, 7:30–9 PM, Soulé Hall. Taught by the Rev. Judy Joy

The small book of James placed after the book of Hebrews and before 1 Peter in the New Testament letters is a fascinating book to study because of its many different elements. Martin Luther wanted to remove it from the canon of scripture because he believed it contradicted Paul's presentation of the gospel and the Reformed emphasis on faith alone. John Calvin accepted the book. Most contemporary commentators find it rich in wisdom for the Christian life today. The book of James is described as a letter, but it is not addressed to a specific church. The book has the flavor of wisdom literature in some of its succinct aphorisms and is also filled with imperatives telling us how to live and practice faith. In this class we will study James' message to discover how God is speaking to us today.





The Mystery of the Incarnation

Sundays, November 6–20, 11:30 AM, Soulé Hall. Taught by the Rev. Steve Whitney

Angels and shepherds, Herod and the Wise Men, "In the beginning was the Word"—many of us know the Christmas Story well. And rightly so. The Incarnation may be the biggest miracle there is. In Jesus, God took on human flesh and lived with us. But have you ever wondered why the three Gospels that mention Jesus' birth tell the story so differently? In this three-week class, we'll look at the way Matthew, Luke, and John describe Jesus' coming into the world. We'll explore the struggles described in each Gospel and the Glory of God that each reveals. We'll also look at what each author emphasizes, what it meant to the people of the time, and how each story holds together on its own and also works with the others to make a greater whole.

Going Deeper: Practices for Spiritual Growth (An Advent Retreat)

Saturday, December 10, 9:30 AM-12:30 PM, Fireside Room. Led by Jim Peterson and Judy Beggs

This half-day retreat will explore, through presentations and exercises, a few spiritual practices that can open one up to a deeper relationship with God. The retreat will provide opportunities for learning, personal reflection, and the chance to learn from one another's experiences. The goal of the retreat is to have participants leave with a sense of the next step each wants to take on the path of deeper relationship with the divine, both personally and in community.

Luci Lights Brighten the Future of Gaza's Children

Rebuilding Alliance is sending solar-powered inflatable lights to the children of Gaza; they're on their fourth shipping container now. Three Palestinian NGO's distribute the lights. Only four hours of electricity are available each day, so the lights allow the children to do homework in the evening and bring comfort and hope to those who experienced bombing and displacement.

See Luci Lights at our Fair Trade display the first Sunday of each month and occasionally other Sundays. Buy one light for \$20 (including \$5 donation) or contribute to the purchase of lights for the children. Almost \$500 was donated by SVPC in September. Your help is needed to send a light to every child in Gaza.

Toiletry Donations

Where do those toiletries I donate end up? Throughout the spring, summer and fall most of our toiletries go to First Presbyterian Church San Jose which hosts a mobile shower



for the homeless twice a week called Dignity on Wheels, a collaboration between Project WeHOPE, Downtown Streets Team and Trinity Church in Sunnyvale. While people are showering, their laundry is put into mesh bags for washing. Most people might take a hot shower and clean clothes for granted, but for the region's homeless, both are often luxuries. Your donation of toiletries helps support this caring ministry. During the winter, we also donate toiletries to the Faith in Action Rotating Shelter and the Home First Winter Shelter. So please remember the homeless when you travel and bring home the unused toiletries from your room or pick up an extra bar of soap or bottle of shampoo when you're out shopping. Toiletries can be dropped off during the food drive or at the church mail room.
