Wants to control development

Civic activist to run for board

Annandale civic activist Sharon Bulova declared her candidacy for the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors on Tuesday.

Bulova, a Democrat, will face Annandale businessman Pat Mullins, a Republican, in the race to fill the seat vacated by Supervisor Audrey Moore.

Moore, in a joint campaign kickoff with Bulova, announced Tuesday she will run against Republican Jack Herrity for the county board chairmanship.

Bulova has been a legislative aide to Moore since 1984 and said she will campaign on the same platform of imposing greater local control

over development.

She said if elected she would also push efforts to get more corporate day-care centers in the county.

Bulova, 39, has promoted commuter rail service for southern county residents and has been active in civic affairs in Annandale for several years. She is former president of the Kings Park West Civic Association.

She has a business management degree from the Northern Virginia Community College.

She and her husband, Dick, have lived in Northern Virginia since 1966 and have two children, David, 17, and Karin, 15. The election will be held Nov. 3.
