MITCH BLOCH

Mitch and his family have been members of Temple Isaiah for several years. Despite a long gap, there is a wonderful connection to the Temple as Mitch had his Bar Mitzvah there in 1979.

Mitch has a bachelor's degree from Emory University and a law degree from Pepperdine. He is currently the owner of California Closeouts and Liquidations which buys and sells closeout and liquidated merchandise.

DAVID CHIU

David has been a member of Temple Isaiah since 2014. He serves as a greeter for Friday Night Shabbat Services, and also helps to coordinate the volunteer bagel pick-up for Rabbi Klein Miles's Saturday morning Torah Study minyan - both are things he attends weekly.

As a member of the Green Team, David has assisted in putting on environmental education events for Temple Isaiah, as well advocated for climate legislation at LA City Hall and our State Capitol in Sacramento. He has also written many articles for The Isaian, both on behalf of the Green Team and as an individual. In addition, David has joined Janet Hirsch and others in conjunction with ONE-LA to advocate for policy changes in housing and immigration. He helped write Isaiah's 2017 Purim Shpiel, was honored to deliver a Shabbat sermon on the history and theology of the Jews of medieval China, and presented a lecture for Isaians on his experiences visiting his ancestral shtetl in Lithuania. This year, David was awarded the Temple Isaiah Emerging Leaders Award.

As screenwriters, David and his writing partner have written an episode for the Amazon Prime series LORE, sold a VR project to Dreamscape Immersive for development with Sam Raimi and Walter Parkes, and wrote a biopic about Rod Serling that made Tracking Board's 2015 Hit List.

David draws inspiration from his Chinese and Litvak heritages, and is a member of a Los Angeles group for Jews of Color. He has written a piece for the Jewish Women's Theatre show True Colors, which explores the experiences of multiracial Jews.

Professionally, Idelle is a freelance writer and author. Her work has appeared in the Washington Post, Time magazine, the Los Angeles Times and several other publications. She is the co-author of a New York Times-reviewed book on health.
