Health & Safety Protocols for Indoor Events

July 15, 2020

Wellness Screening

- All participants must RSVP or register prior to the event. Walk ins will not be permitted.
- Prior to entering the building, each person must confirm that they:
 - Have no flu-like symptoms, no signs of a fever and if they have taken their temperature it is below 100.3, no new cough, muscle aches, nasal congestion, loss of smell/taste or shortness of breath within the past 48 hours.
 - Have not had close contact with an individual diagnosed with COVID-19 or exhibiting flu-like symptoms in the past 48 hours.
 - Have not been asked to self-isolate or quarantine by their doctor or local public health official.
- If someone exhibits symptoms while in the building, they will be asked to leave by the event leaders/staff. The Executive Director will be informed and will follow up with the individual after the event.
- Individuals who have traveled out of state within the last 2 weeks may not be allowed to attend the event based on the existing guidelines from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.
- If an attendee is diagnosed with COVID-19 in the two weeks following the event, they should notify the Executive Director, who will notify the local Board of Health and work with it to trace contacts and advise others to isolate and self-quarantine. Testing may be recommended for others consistent with guidance or at the request of the local health board. TBA will not disclose the name of the person who has been diagnosed with Covid-19 for privacy reasons.

Hygiene & Sanitization

- Everyone will be asked to use hand sanitizer or wash their hands as soon as they enter the building.
- The building will be cleaned and sanitized between groups and/or events.
- Food may not be served in the Temple.

Social Distancing

- Group size limits will be determined based on the space used, the activity planned and subject to the approval of the Executive Director in consultation with the Health & Safety Task Force.
- Individuals not in the same household must maintain a physical distance of 6 feet or more.
- Everyone must wear a cloth or disposable face mask when they are inside the building unless doing so would be unsafe due to a medical condition or disability.
- Duration of the event cannot exceed 60 minutes.

Health & Safety Protocols for Outdoor Events

Wellness Screening

- All participants must RSVP or register prior to the event. Walk ins will not be permitted.
- Prior to attending the event, each person must confirm that they:

- If an attendee is diagnosed with COVID-19 in the two weeks following the event, they should notify the Executive Director, who will notify the local Board of Health and work with it to trace contacts and advise others to isolate and self-quarantine. Testing may be recommended for others consistent with guidance or at the request of the local health board. TBA will not disclose the name of the person who has been diagnosed with Covid-19 for privacy reasons.

Hygiene & Sanitization

- Hand sanitizer will be available for all participants.
- No one will be permitted inside Temple Beth Avodah during the event except under emergency situations. Bathroom use is discouraged but permitted if needed. Should the event need to move inside for weather related reasons, indoor protocols must be followed.
- If there is food or drink present, it must be in individual servings. No alcohol will be permitted.

Social Distancing

- Group size limits will be determined based on the area used, the activity planned and subject to the approval of the Executive Director.
- Individuals not in the same household must maintain a physical distance of 6 feet or more.
- Face masks are not required while participants remain greater than 6 ft and are outdoors.
- Duration of the event cannot exceed 90 minutes.
