## A Culture of Storytelling

This is Caleb's first day to wear underwear to OPCC preschool program. He includes many floating children in his drawing—all with underwear and smiling faces. This is “me in underwear” he says to OPCC educator Antonia. He explains, the yellow cat is happy because he doesn't have to wear underwear; but this purple cat is different. He draws his own cat from home called Whitsey. He explains, “Whitsey is frowning because he wants to wear the underwear but can't... because he is a cat.”



Caleb's emotional well-being is expressed here through his creative story-telling and visual art. Toilet training is a very important psychological step for children. Caleb is no exception. We all live in a culture of storytelling that help us make meaning of the world around us.

This Fall we have four full days of programs being offered at 16 Mile Creek Sports Complex (North of Dundas), will be opening an new permanent location at Queen Elizabeth Park Community Centre to service our families in south Oakville and continue to offer programs at North Service Road and our very popular Oakwood Elementary School.


Our Discovery Station Emergent Learning Program (previously Nursery School) has begun registration, and as usual if very popular so please register soon to guarantee your child spot in our program. We have many morning options for your 18 months to 5 years old child including an extended day program to meet your needs. This 10 month program is designed to ensure your child's success upon entering school, focused on ensuring the foundational skills necessary are being developed through age appropriate learning activities that align with the Ministry of Education's pre-kindergarten programs. We continue to offer music, infant massage and Little Creators as part of our very popular Enrichment Program Series and look forward to announcing a few new surprises for you as more details are available stay tuned to our web-site and social media for updates!

Most importantly we would like to draw your attention to a new child care option that will be available late fall at OPCC called Occasional Care. We are working with the Ministry of Education to launch a casual drop off care program that will bring the same standard of care and education for your child that would be available in any licenced centre program. We have heard from many families that the need to have care on occasion is important and valued for those who may not have family to assist, work part-time or are self employed. We are piloting this initiative this Fall and look forward to your participation and feedback as we move forward in this new venture providing flexible childcare options for families. ## Welcome to OPCC and our EarlyON programs!

We strive to create a warm and caring community where families with young children can learn and grow together. We invite you to become part of our OPCC family and enjoy your time with us.

This fact sheet has been designed to ensure families are aware of what EarlyON is and what you can expect when you are here. The safety and enjoyment of all family members who attend our programs is of the utmost importance to us so please read on to learn more.

### What is EarlyON?

EarlyON programs are early learning programs that are fully funded by Ontario's Ministry of Education, managed by the Region of Halton and operated in the Oakville area by OPCC. These programs are offered across the province, at a variety of times and locations, including evenings/weekends, and are free of charge. At OPCC, families can enjoy our clean, well equipped spaces where exploration and discovery are encouraged. Professional and knowledgeable educators are always available to help you with your questions, share ideas and experiences and assist families by connecting to each other and community resources.

### To ensure the health, safety and enjoyment of all families, we ask that you please note the following:

- We regret that we are unable to accommodate children outside of newborn to 6 years due to our funding regulations
- To ensure safe spaces, capacity in programs is based on fire regulations and are not negotiable. Where possible, when programs fill up, we will post full signs for your convenience
- We want children's play areas to be as clean as possible. Please bring indoor shoes. We have very young children in our programs, as well as lots of floor play
- If your child shows signs of illness please keep them home. Should your child become ill during the program we ask that you take them home, so they can rest, recover and not spread illness to others. It is recommended that children who are vomiting or have diarrhea wait 24 hours after symptoms have subsided before joining others
- Your children appreciate your focused and undivided attention. Please put cell phones on vibrate and keep them in your pocket. Our educators are here to support you and your children as you play and interact together, not to provide childminding services. Our programs offer many opportunities for families to connect and build relationships with each other. It is our belief that cell phones and computers hinder this opportunity
- To access programs, you will require an OPCC account. Accounts can be set up through our website. Upon arrival at programs you will be asked to sign in
- We love to hear from you. If you have skills, talents, questions or ideas please share them. You can speak to the educators, email us or contact the office by phone. Your feedback is always welcome
- Inclement weather policy: OPCC will close if the Halton District School Board closes schools. Please check local news stations or social media if you are unsure
- Follow us on social media: Stay in the loop and up to date on what is happening at OPCC. Closures, changes to programs, upcoming events are all communicated electronically through our email list and on social media
- Children must always be accompanied by an adult 18+
- We are attempting to be a nut free facility, so please do not bring nut products or any food items where the ingredient label states "may contain nuts, nut products, or nut oils"

### What you can expect at an EarlyON program:

- To be welcomed
- Safe, clean and age appropriate play spaces that promote children's curiosity, and natural desire to explore and learn
- Opportunities to meet other families
- Access to current information about child development, parenting, community resources and other topics that matter to you
- Visits from our Family Support Coordinator and other guests from time to time
- Many of our programs document children's learning through photographs and stories. Be sure to take a look around and see what's happening as children learn through play
- Lots of fun! Music, movement, literacy, songs and stories are part of all of our drop in programs on a regular basis

### Babftime

**For children newborn to 6 months.** It is never too early to introduce your child to reading. See your baby laugh and smile as you sing, clap, bounce and learn rhymes together. All participants are welcome to stay, play and chat after the session. This program is offered in partnership with the Oakville Public Library.

### New Parent Meet Up

**For children newborn to 6 months.** Are you a new parent who wants to meet other new parents or caregivers in your neighbourhood? Following our weekly Babftime program we will open up our program room for new parents to get together, learn, share, and connect with one another. Not new to parenthood? Join us to share your knowledge and experiences! This program is offered in partnership with the Oakville Public Library.

### Songs & Snuggles

**For children newborn to 12 months.** Formerly Mother Goose. Bring your baby and join in the fun. Meet other parents and babies, learn some new songs/rhymes and be reminded of some familiar ones from your childhood. This program is designed to support your relationship with your baby and help you to discover the magic of singing to help get through the day.

### Baby & Me Meet Up

**For children newborn to 18 months.** Families need each other for support, to share stories and have fun. Babies and toddlers can bring their moms, dads, and other important people to join us, connect, make new friends or hang out with familiar ones. Our well-equipped playroom makes this a fun time for your little one too. Occasional guests will join the group to help with any questions or concerns you may have about your child, resources in the community and lots more!

### Fun for Little Ones

**For children newborn to 24 months.** Babies and toddlers are curious about the world. This is a program designed just for them. A variety of experiences led by the children's interests will encourage them to see, touch and explore what is around them. Our educator will encourage curiosity and wonder and create opportunities for children to learn more about their ideas and their environment. Our Family Support Coordinator will visit from time to time to help answer your questions about this fascinating (and sometimes exhausting) stage of development.

### Tales and Tunes

**For children 6 to 12 months.** Music and stories are an important part of childhood, and essential to opening a child's mind to possibilities. They build a strong foundation for future literacy skills, social and emotional competence and creativity while having lots of fun. Join our educator as she takes you and your child on a journey exploring the best of old and new stories and songs.

### Jump, Jiggle and Groove

**For children 18 months to 4 years.** Children need to move... a lot. This active program encourages children from 18 months – 4 years and their grownups to get up, move and get their groove on. Equipment that encourages big muscle development, balance and co-ordination will be available. In addition, music, games and dancing are part of the fun as children learn about how they can move their bodies, develop motor skills and build healthy habits.

#### Nature Explorers Club

**For children newborn to 6 years.** The research is clear and tells us that being outdoors has numerous benefits for you and your children, including better physical and mental health, improved sleep, reduced stress, a heightened sense of wonder and curiosity, and better developed self-regulation skills. Join us for weekly adventures in nature's classroom, where we will take our time, observe, explore and learn about the world, ourselves and each other. This drop-in program will run rain or shine (except in extreme weather) so be sure to dress for the weather and join us as we play the natural way. You won't melt in the rain or turn into a popsicle when it cools down, we promise, and will leave feeling better than when you arrived.

## What is emergent learning?

Emergent learning is a philosophy of educating and planning curriculum that focuses on being responsive to children's interests and creating meaningful learning experiences. Our approach is child-initiated, reflective and active to the children's needs.

## Why does OPCC utilize this approach?

Emergent learning is a superior model of education. It supports the Ontario Ministry of Education's Provincial philosophy and aligns with Halton Public and Catholic School Board's curriculum.

## How Does Learning Happen?

When children are engaged in learning based on their interests, they have a natural motivation to learn. In the early years, children are engaged predominately through play and so it is utilized as a means to develop the foundations they will need to prepare for kindergarten.

## What will they learn?

Through emergent learning, children will be involved in variety of learning opportunities to enhance their discovery and problem solving abilities which builds a strong foundation in all areas; social, emotional, cognitive, physical and language
