The Ohio Manufacturing Workforce Partnership (OMWP), a statewide workforce collaboration led by The Ohio Manufacturers' Association and Ohio TechNet, has been awarded a \$12 million U.S. Department of Labor grant to scale apprenticeship programs across the state.

Jessica Borza is the Executive Director of the Mahoning Valley Manufacturers Coalition (MVMC), an industry-led group focused on critical workforce shortages, particularly in the skilled trades. Jessica led the organization through a strategic planning process designed to convene, educate and mobilize the region's key stakeholders and opinion leaders to initiate action in order to prepare, recruit and retain a workforce that is qualified for the specific needs of the manufacturing industry. She facilitates dialogue between industry and education to create responsive education and training programs and provide seamless career pathways. MVMC is 90 members strong and has attracted more than \$17M in member dues, grants and sponsorships, including the U.S. Department of Labor Workforce Innovation Fund grant and the Greater Oh-Penn Manufacturing Apprenticeship Grant which Jessica authored.

Jessica also serves as a Strategic Advisor at Thomas P. Miller and Associates, a consulting firm focused on workforce and economic development. Jessica previously served as the Chief Operating Officer for the One-Stop Workforce System in Mahoning and Columbiana Counties in Ohio where, during her tenure, the One-Stop was rated number one in Ohio and was widely recognized as a high performing workforce system—including best practices in business services.

Bernie Gosky is Lorain County Community College's consortium Project Manager for Ohio TechNet, which launched with a \$15M U.S. Department of Labor grant that partnered 11 community colleges throughout Ohio to support advanced manufacturing. The Ohio TechNet consortium continues to expand with all 28 higher education partners. As the prior Executive Director for Intern in Ohio and for Summer on the Cuyahoga, her career has focused on Ohio's talent attraction and retention issues. Bernie has a B.S. in

Business Administration from Bowling Green State University.

Terri Burgess Sandu is the Director of Talent and Business Innovation at Lorain County Community College. In this role, Sandu leads a team of professionals whose work advances the college's commitment to student success and talent development that accelerates business growth.
