- 1st place — \$3000 To be donated to charity of choice
- 2nd place — \$2000 To be donated to charity of choice
- 3rd place — \$1000 To be donated to charity of choice

Monday, December 21st: each of the judging groups will submit their top *five* selections to the Grand Judge, who will determine the top *three* in ranking from 1st place to 3rd place. The SF Chronicle will announce the winners and the charities they selected.
