San Francisco, CA – The San Francisco Firefighters Cancer Prevention Foundation ([SFFCPF](#)) will sponsor the [Galleri Multi-Cancer Early Detection Test](#), which can detect more than 50 types of cancer in the earliest stages to any active or retired SFFD members (who meet the criteria). The Galleri test is done through a simple blood draw and works by detecting fragments of DNA in the blood that have been "shed" by cancer cells ([learn more HERE](#)). If a cancer signal is detected in the blood, the Galleri test can determine where in the body that signal is coming from with high accuracy.
