January 25 “Leading Across Multiple Sectors: From Corporate Boards to the C-Suite and the Community” featuring **Duriya Farooqui, former Executive Director of Atlanta Committee for Progress (ACP)** Duriya is on the BD of Directors of Intercontinental Exchange (ICE) and New York Stock Exchange (NYSE). She is also an Advisor to Engage Ventures. Prior to ACP, she was a principal at Bain & Company and has served as the COO for the City of ATL where she managed a budget of over \$2B and 7000+ employees. Duriya holds an M.P.A. in International Development from Harvard’s Kennedy School of Government, and a B.A. in Economics and Mathematics from Hampshire College. Highly respected for her civic engagement, Duriya is a Trustee of the Woodruff Arts Center and Agnes Scott College and is a member of the Rotary Club of ATL.

February 28: “NextGen Talent: What You Don’t Know is Tanking Your Bottom Line” featuring **Amanda Hammett – Entrepreneur / Speaker / Consultant**. Hired as one of IBM’s youngest Technical Recruiters after graduating from Agnes Scott College, she later left and launched 2 multi-million dollar companies before turning 26, and she led them to a large client base across 85 countries. While speaking to more than 1M millennials, they nicknamed her ‘The Millennial Translator’ as she barnstormed the U.S. (800 keynotes across 25 states). Working with colleges and universities, she helped prepare students before they transition into corporate America. Currently she’s working with Fortune 500 companies helping them understand and maximize their top millennial talent and prepare for the future including the succession of leadership. Amanda serves as the Corporate Board President of the GA Hugh O’Brien Youth Leadership Foundation and is a wife and mother.

March 22: “Stand Out as a Leader: Less Stress, Higher Energy, More Confidence” featuring **Adele Wang, Transformational Mentor**. Adele works with clients to increase their visibility and presence (the “it” factor). She had a successful corporate career with several F50 companies before transitioning into her current role 15 years ago. She’s trained with top pioneers in the field of energy healing and leadership, has a certification in energy medicine and uses her expertise to help individuals in their careers and for their health and well-being. Adele has a special focus on helping women be successful using their unique feminine traits. She has a B.S. degree in Economics and M.S. in Industrial Relations from Univ. of Wisconsin-Madison.

April 26: “Learning from Leaders Who Inspire Others: A Panel of Inspiritors” featuring **Donna Buchanan, former COO of United Way of Metro Atlanta; Theresa Spralling, Director, Diversity & Inclusion, AT&T; and Dr. Lana Wachniak, Professor Emeritus of Criminal Justice and Sociology at KSU** – Donna received TLG’s 2018 Leadership Character Award in the Inspiritor Category and both Theresa and Lana were nominees as well. Donna’s also known for other roles including President / CEO of Jr. Achievement. As the former CEO of Women of AT&T’s national chapter, Theresa helped grow the organization to over 25,000 members, among many other accomplishments in her life and career. Lana began her teaching career at GSU and was the first female recipient of their distinguished teaching award. At KSU, she started Homeless Awareness Week and along with others, the Orange Duffel Bag Initiative. All three are role models of servant leadership.

May 24: “One Entrepreneur’s Story: Cooking Up Trust, Teamwork and Long-Term Success” featuring **Mary Moore, Founder & CEO, The Cook’s Warehouse**. Among the Atlanta Business Chronicle’s “2018 Most Admired CEOs,” Mary has received numerous awards during her career, including a POW! Award, an ICON Achievement Award, Global Innovator Award, a Distinguished Alumni Award, and induction into the YWCA’s Academy of Women Achievers. Passionate about all things cooking and entrepreneurial, she’s also committed to giving back and highly engaged in the community, e.g., Immediate Past Chair, ATL Food Bank; BD of Directors, Metro ATL Chamber; and Past President, Les Dames d’Escoffier International Board.

June 21: “Leveraging the Science of Positive Psychology, Emotional Intelligence and Mindfulness in Business” featuring **Dr. Patricia Thompson, President of Silver Lining Psychology and Senior Consultant – Turknett Leadership Group**. As a corporate psychologist and management consultant including 10 years with Sperduto & Associates, Patricia has worked with companies all across North America and conducted workshops and seminars at Wharton Business School, the Univ. of Toronto, and many other prestigious institutions. She’s also an author, a featured expert in various media outlets, and the recipient of multiple awards for excellence in research from organizations like the American Psychological Association. Patricia uses her background and experience to help her coaching clients achieve a higher level of leadership and personal effectiveness. Originally from Alberta, Canada, she received her M.A. and Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from GSU.

Senior program designer for all 33 sports venues in the ’96 Olympics, for the past 13 years she’s been Principal Architect in a \$7B joint venture including the expansion of Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta Int’l Airport. In 2018 her firm also completed the 35,000 sq. ft. Gladys Dennard Library at South Fulton. Cheryl received her undergraduate degree in Architecture from Kansas State University and her Master of Architecture in Urban Design from Harvard. She’s served on the BD of the Alumni Assoc. for Kansas State and Harvard.

August 23: “An American Roboticist: A Dream Fulfilled” featuring Dr. Ayanna Howard, Chair of the School of Interactive Computing, Endowed Chair in Bioengineering and Director of the Human-Automation Systems Lab at Georgia Tech. Inspired at an early age by the TV show The Bionic Woman, Ayanna received her B.S. in Engineering from Brown University and her M.S. and Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Southern California. She began her career at NASA’s Jet Propulsion Laboratory receiving worldwide attention for her SnoMote robots designed to study the impact of global warming on the Antarctic ice shelves. In 2013 she founded Zyrobotics focusing on therapy and educational products for children with special needs. Her research interests include human-robot interaction, Artificial Intelligence and much more. .

September 20: “Purpose-Driven Leadership in Business, Non Profit, the Arts & More” featuring Doug Shipman, President and CEO of The Woodruff Arts Center. Previous leadership roles include CEO/Managing Director, BrightHouse, founding CEO of the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, and principal with the Boston Consulting Group with offices in NY, ATL, and Mumbai. Across multiple sectors, Doug’s contributions are extraordinary - from strategic planning, to fundraising, to transformation and value creation. A magna cum laude graduate of Emory Univ., he also holds master degrees in Theological Studies and Public Policy from Harvard. Doug serves various organizations, e.g., the BD of the Carter Center, the Metro Chamber, the ATL CVB etc. Not surprisingly, he’s recognized among ATL & GA’s “Most Influential” citizens.

Her dedication to growing the brand and inspiring a culture of purpose led Forbes to name her, “one of the five great American entrepreneurs you haven’t heard of yet but should know.” Committed to sharing her journey, this entrepreneur, motivational speaker and inspirational leader reminds individuals to dream big and chase those ambitions relentlessly.

November 15: “Transformational Leadership: A Purposeful Mission, A Compelling Vision and the Pursuit of Excellence” featuring Lisa Y. Gordon, President and CEO of Atlanta Habitat for Humanity. Lisa has set the nonprofit homebuilder on a new course to become a catalyst for holistic neighborhood redevelopment. In 2017 under her leadership the organization was recognized as an Affiliate of Distinction by Habitat for Humanity International. Previously, Lisa was VP and COO for the Atlanta Beltline, Inc; a cabinet member in former Mayor Shirley Franklin’s administration; City Mgr. of East Point and Assistant City Mgr. of Austin, TX. She holds an undergraduate degree from Georgetown University as well as two master’s degrees. She’s also a CPA. Among her many honors are: 2018 Women Who Mean Business honoree; Fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration; and a 2017 YWCA Woman of Achievement.
