

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

Set us free, O God, from the bondage of our sins, and give us the liberty of that abundant life which you have made known to us in your Son our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Lessons

The people are seated for the readings of the day.

The First Reading Isaiah 6:1-8, [9-13]

The year King Uzziah died, I saw a vision of God sitting on a throne, way up high. The hem of the robe he wore filled the whole temple. Angels were all around him. Each of them had six wings, two to cover their faces, two to cover their feet, and two to fly with. They were calling back and forth to each other, “Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of hosts. The whole earth is full of glory.” The doorways shook at their voices, and the place filled with smoke. I was scared, “I am doomed,” I cried. “For I’m a sinful person with unclean lips and yet I have seen the King, the Lord of hosts, with my very eyes.”

Then one of the angels flew over to me, holding a burning hot coal with a pair of tongs that he’d just taken from the altar in the temple. He touched my mouth with it and said, “Now that this has touched your lips, you’re not sinful anymore.” Then I heard God speak, “Who can I get to do my work for me? Who should I send?” I spoke up and said, “I’m the one you can send, God. Here I am. Send me.” Then God said, “Go and say this to the people: Keep listening, everyone, but you’re not going to get it. Keep looking even though you won’t see. Stop up your ears and close your eyes and turn off your brain. Then turn and be healed.”

“How long should I say that, God?” I asked. God said, “Until I send everyone far away and their land is completely empty. When everything is burned to the ground, there will be a tiny holy seed in the stump of the last tree that was cut down.”

Jesus was standing by the lake, and the people were crowding around him to hear what he had to say. He got into a boat that belonged to Simon and asked him to push out into the lake. Then Jesus sat down in the boat and started teaching the people on the shore.

When he was done talking, he said to Simon, “Let’s go out into deeper water and see what we can catch with your nets.” Simon said, “Jesus, we fished there all night long and didn’t catch a thing. But if you want, we’ll do that and I’ll let down the nets.” Was Simon surprised when they caught so many fish they didn’t know what to do with them! Their nets began to break they were so full of fish.

Simon signaled the other boat to come and help them. They filled up both boats so full of fish that they began to sink. When Simon saw that, he fell on his knees in front of Jesus and said, “You are so holy, I don’t think I should even be near you. You know Jesus, I am really sinful. I don’t think I can take all this holiness.”

But Jesus said to Simon, “Do not be afraid; from now on I will show you how to catch people and bring them to God.” The brought their boats in to shore, and Simon and his partners, James and John, left everything behind and followed Jesus.

All Stand. The Celebrant says to the people.
