


Opening Acclamation

The Lessons

The First Reading Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28

God says this to the people of Jerusalem:

I will cause a strong wind to blow in judgement against you. You are foolish, stupid people. You know all about doing evil but have no idea how to do good. I looked down on earth, and it was a wasteland. And the heavens had no light. The mountains were shaking, and the hills were moving back and forth. The people had deserted the earth. The orchards were now deserts and the cities were in ruins. I will not destroy you completely. The earth will mourn. The heavens will dress in black and sorrow. I mean it. I will not turn back.

Reader Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Thanks be to God.

Psalm 14 The Reader will begin, and the congregation will respond with verses in BOLD.

Foolish people tell themselves, "There is no God. All of us do horrid things. None of us is good." God sees all of us and wonders if any of us is wise. Is there even one of us who seeks God?

The Gospel: Luke 15:1-10

All standing, the Deacon or Priest reads the Gospel

Deacon or Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

The tax collectors and sinners were coming close to Jesus to listen to him. The Pharisees and other leaders were grumbling, saying, "Look at him; eating and talking with all those sinners." So, he told them a story: There was a man who had one hundred sheep, and he loved each one of them. One of them got lost, so he left the ninety-nine in the wilderness to search for the lost one. He looked and looked, calling his name. Finally he found it and put it on his shoulders and was relieved and happy. When he got home, he had a party with his friends and neighbors and said, "Be happy for me. I finally found that one sheep of mine that was lost." That's how it is in heaven, when one sinner turns from his ways and joins the ninety-nine who had never strayed.

If you has ten silver coins and lost one, wouldn't you keep your lamp lit all night, and sweep the entire house, looking under everything for that last coin? Then you would tell everyone you know how awful you felt when that coin was lost, and how happy you are now that it is found. The angels in heaven party all night over one sinner who changes his ways and turns to God.

During the silence after each bidding, the people may offer their own prayers, either silently or aloud.

God, Giver of life, Hear our prayer.

Lover of all you have made, we thank you for the wondrous diversity of your creatures, and we pray for their well-being. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, Hear our prayer.

Author of the book of nature, receive our gratitude for places of restoration and healing, and continue to bless those places that feed our lives and spirits. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, **Hear our prayer**.

Wise Creator, whose works are full of mystery, give us wonder and appreciation for your creatures with whom we find ourselves in conflict. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, **Hear our prayer**.

Giver of all good gifts, awaken us daily to our dependence upon your bounty, and make us always thankful for the abundance of your blessings. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, Hear our prayer.

Divine Physician, heal our communities, especially those where neglect, greed, or violence inflict suffering upon people and other creatures. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, **Hear our prayer**.

Comforter of all the earth, sustain the people of this congregation who desire or need your presence and help, especially those on our parish prayer list. *Silence*.

God, Giver of life, Hear our prayer.

Rock and refuge of all your creatures, receive into everlasting mercy all those who have died. *Silence*. God, Giver of life, **Hear our prayer**.

The Priest concludes with a closing Collect.

The Confession and Absolution

The Celebrant then says

Let us confess our sins to God.

Silence may be kept.

Minister and People

God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.

The Celebrant stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

The Peace

All Stand. The Celebrant says to the people.

'O ke aloha o ka Haku ka mea e mau loa aku me 'oukou.

(The peace of the Lord be always with you!)

The People respond.

A me 'oe pū nō ho'i.

(And also with you!)

Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. (Ephesians 5:2)



And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.


And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

The Celebrant says

Nā Makana a Ke Akua na ka Po'e o Ke Akua. / The gifts of God for the people of God.

At the time of distribution, those who wish to receive should move forward to the altar rail in two lines, filling in from makai to mauka. You may kneel or stand to receive the sacrament. You are welcome to receive the bread (traditional or gluten-free) only <u>or</u> both the bread and the wine from the ministers who will come past you. If you wish to receive a blessing, place your hands across your heart as you approach.
