

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us pray.

O God, whose blessed Son came into the world that he might destroy the works of the devil and make us children of God and heirs of eternal life: Grant that, having this hope, we may purify ourselves as he is pure; that, when he comes again with power and great glory, we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Lessons

The First Reading The Book of Haggai 1:15b-2:9

God told a prophet named Haggai to speak to the people who had been dragged away from their homes to live in a strange land:

Are there any people who remember the good old days?

How do things look to you now? Things seem pretty bad, don't they?

But don't you worry. Find the courage that is deep inside you because your God is with you! Just as God promised to be with you always and brought you out of Egypt. Don't be afraid, God's Spirit is inside of you.

"Pretty soon, I'll make this all better. I will shake everything up, and when I'm done shaking, this place will be a palace. Everything belongs to me," God says. "And I'll make your lives better than you could ever imagine. Better than they used to be. Don't be afraid. It will happen."

Reader Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Thanks be to God.

Psalm 145:1-5, 18-21 The Reader will begin, and the congregation will respond with verses in BOLD.

The Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

All standing, the Deacon or Priest reads the Gospel

Deacon or Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Some people, who didn't believe in life after death, found Jesus and asked him this trick question, "So Jesus, you're a teacher. Moses taught us if a man's brother dies and leaves a wife but no children, he should marry her and have some children with her. So, what if there are seven brothers in all, and each one dies after having married that

woman and still there are no children? When the woman dies, whose wife is she anyway? Who is her husband in heaven, since she had been married to all seven of them?"

Jesus said, "You know what? People marry each other on earth, but after they die everything is different. They are children of a NEW life. People who die are raised, but God isn't concerned about dead people, but about living people. For to God all of them ARE alive."

The Nicene Creed

Found on the FRONT cover or flap of The Book of Common Prayer.

The Prayers of the People (From The Church of England's "Times and Seasons") During the silence after each bidding, the people may offer their own prayers, either silently or aloud.

Reader: The risen Christ is here in the midst of us. We bring our prayers to Christ as Head of the Church.

Reader: For the Church universal, of which these buildings are a visible symbol,

People: Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For this congregation, as we remember your promise that when two or three are gathered in your name you are there in the midst of them,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For this place, that we may be still and know that you are God,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For the fulfilling of our desires and petitions as you see best for us,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For your blessings in the past and for a vision for the future,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For the gift of the Holy Spirit and new life in baptism,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For a foretaste of your eternal kingdom in the sacrament of the eucharist,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For the blessing of our vows and the crowning of our years with your goodness,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For the faith of those who have gone before us and for grace to persevere like them,

Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

For the benefactors of this place who have died in the peace of Christ and are at rest, Lord, receive our thanks and prayer.

The Priest concludes with a closing Collect.

The Confession and Absolution

The Celebrant then says
Let us confess our sins to God.
Silence may be kept.

Minister and People

God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.

The Celebrant stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

The Peace

All Stand. The Celebrant says to the people.

'O ke aloha o ka Haku ka mea e mau loa aku me 'oukou.

(The peace of the Lord be always with you!)

The People respond.

A me 'oe pū nō ho'i.

(And also with you!)

Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. (Ephesians 5:2)

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.


And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

The Celebrant says

At the time of distribution, those who wish to receive should move forward to the altar rail in two lines, filling in from makai to mauka. You may kneel or stand to receive the sacrament. You are welcome to receive the bread (traditional or gluten-free) only <u>or</u> both the bread and the wine from the ministers who will come past you. If you wish to receive a blessing, place your hands across your heart as you approach.
