The **TDPS New Play Workshop** is an opportunity to develop a short play in a supportive environment.

Six playwrights will be selected, and assigned a mentor who is a professional dramatist living and working in the Baltimore-DC corridor.

Mentors will serve as guides through the process of rehearsing with a director and actors, filtering and implementing feedback, and revising.

The weeklong event will kick off on **Monday, March 5, 2018**, with a professional panel on new play development, and will conclude on **Sunday, March 11, 2018**, with staged readings of the new plays.

- Plays must be written by a **current TDPS undergraduate student** in good academic standing who are not in rehearsals for another show between March 5-11.
- Plays must be approximately **10 minutes long** when read aloud. (8–12 pages, written in 12-pt Times New Roman font and following a generally accepted playwriting format.)
 - Plays must have a cast of **2-3 characters** (doubling is permitted).
- Plays must be intended for **live performance onstage**.
 - Plays must be considered to be “**in development**” (you are interested in further developing the play based on the workshop experience).
- You may submit **one play**. If you submitted a script that was not selected for last year's workshop, you may resubmit that script if it has been substantially revised.
- Along with the script, please submit **3 specific questions you want to explore** during the workshop (150 words maximum).
