Message from Thack

In May 1995, I went on a five-week pilgrimage to the Holy Land based out of St. George's College in Jerusalem. I had dreamed of making this pilgrimage one day. I wanted to see the places where Jesus walked, and get to know the holy city of Jerusalem, the site of so much faith, prayer, and conflict.

And that is what we did. For thirty-three days our group explored the Holy Land and the Sinai in Egypt praying, singing, learning, and discussing. We walked where Jesus and Moses walked. We discovered that the Galilee region, where Jesus grew up and where he spent most of his ministry, is breathtakingly beautiful. It's a rich land covered in fields of date palms and vineyards of olives and grapes. We stood in the Judean wilderness at dawn, imagining Jesus fasting and praying there. At the Jordan River we renewed our baptismal vows. In pre-dawn darkness we walked the Via Dolorosa (Way of Sorrow) in the Old City of Jerusalem tracing Jesus' painful journey to the cross.

We met the Christians of the Holy Land. They relayed their struggles to us, sharing the hardships of life as Palestinians. They also blessed us with extraordinary hospitality—everything from delicious falafel and homemade pita bread near Jesus' birthplace to demitasses of bitter Arab-style coffee in the garden of a Greek Orthodox church on a mountain. Our guides from St. George's College were excellent. They led our journey with humor, thoughtfulness, and patience. They helped to open our eyes to see Jesus in this place.

My soul was transformed by that experience in 1995 and I promised myself I would return to the Holy Land. I did return in 2010, 2018 and 2019. Now I am going back again. Yet each trip so far has been unique and I always experienced something new on each journey. I look forward with anticipation for what the Holy Spirit will reveal to us this time around! Our journey is blessed to be organized by Immanuel Tours in Tel Aviv. Owner Susan Eshed and our faithful guide and friend Lior Rothenberg make sure all our needs are met and have even opened their homes to us.

I discovered in these experiences that people make pilgrimages to experience the presence of God in a new and different place. This is true of a Holy Land pilgrimage. The Holy Land is sacred to all three of the Abrahamic faiths, and it is where Jesus Christ lived, ministered, was crucified, and was resurrected.

However, one should not confuse the adjective "holy" with perfect. The Holy Land is a complex place, torn by conflict. Yet, every time I've traveled there, Jesus walked alongside us. That, for me, was what made it holy. God was right there, in the middle of this harsh reality. In that experience I was reminded of all the struggles and conflicts here at home, of mass shootings, and of the healing reconciliation needed not just in Israel but also in our own neighborhoods and in our own lives. Through this the Holy Land reminded me that God is with us here too, offering hope in our own part of the world.

We begin this next journey this Saturday. We will fly from Pensacola to Atlanta, then Atlanta to JFK in New York, and then the final eleven-hour leg from JFK to Tel Aviv. We will return on June 25. We invite your prayers for us as we travel to, from and in the Holy Land. We will be praying for you as well and will post Morning Prayer from the Holy Land each day. There is a six-hour time difference so it will be posted on Facebook by the time you wake up. Our hope is to return renewed and transformed and look forward to sharing our experiences with you. God bless you.

Tracts Talk! The Book of Common Prayer

Everyone is familiar with the *Book of Common Prayer*, or *BCP*, or just “the prayer book.” Beyond the “grey stripe,” as Bishop Russell once referred to the most used pages containing the Eucharist, rites I and II, there’s much more to this book. The prayer book is so rich, in fact, that Presbyterian, Lutheran and Methodist services have borrowed from it. Looking at the book you see in the pews, you might be surprised to learn that it is 1001 pages. It’s printed on very thin paper. Even in a pocket version of the prayer book, everything is on the same page number as the ones in the pew. It’s printed on very thin paper in a very small font! The reason for this is so that worshippers can follow along with the printed bulletin or page announcements no matter the size of their prayer book. Let’s take a brief look at the history, contents and usage of the *BCP*.

The first prayer book was published in 1549 in an attempt to make public worship simpler. There have been several revisions since 1549, most notably in 1662 and 1979, the one currently in use by the Episcopal Church. (Not to confuse the issue, but...in 2007, changes were made to the 1979 lectionary, or readings, with optional incorporation of those changes to take place in 2007, and mandatory incorporation in 2010. No other changes were made at that time.)

In addition to the Eucharist rites I and II, included are liturgies (services of worship) for the sacraments of confirmation, marriage, ministration to the sick, ordination and others. There are worship services for morning and evening prayer, for seasonal worship, and for special days, such as major holy days. Some services, called Episcopal Services, such as confirmation and ordination, require the presence of a bishop.

The services mentioned so far are typically intended for corporate worship, that is, worship within the community, although many of them can be referenced for individual worship as well. Additionally, *Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families* provide a structured individual liturgy. A whole section of the *BCP*, *Prayers and Thanksgivings*, is devoted to beautiful, lyrical and insightful prayers, and may be used for individual devotions at any time. A section of collects offers prayers for special occasions.

Another section of the prayer book, *Historical Documents of the Church*, is included as reference to those documents deemed essential to Christian understanding. The lectionary provides references to the readings assigned for every day of the year, and a calendar lists holy days and some saints days. If you want to know when Easter falls in 2024, go to page 880.

There is so much more in the prayer book. Pick one up and take a look through it. Start with the Table of Contents to get a good overview, and pick up *The Book of Common Prayer* leaflet for even more information. You can download a free copy of the *BCP* to your electronic device at www.episcopalchurch.org, and this pdf is numbered properly with 1001 pages.

Hello St. Paul's Parishioners:


