Message from Thack

Everyone knows what it is to wait expectantly for something to happen. Whether waiting for the final grades to be posted, the report of job promotions, pregnancy test results, or for that special homecoming for an estranged relative, we all know that feeling of anticipation. In some cases, it can seem like an eternity as we anxiously count the days until the expected event is realized. Yet, for me, it is that period of waiting, that breath-holding time of expectation, that makes the event truly special.

In my sermon last Sunday, I mentioned that the season of Advent is a season of *anticipation*. It is that season in the Christian calendar when we prepare to celebrate Christ's first coming. In fact, the word "advent" comes from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming" or "arrival." Throughout the Advent season we are to expectantly await the coming of Christ. We should know that it is also the time when we focus our attention on Christ's *second coming* at the end of the age. Hence, the season of Advent, perhaps more than any other liturgical season, reminds Christians that they are living in an in-between-time, the time between Jesus' first coming and Jesus' final return. That's why Advent celebrates the tension between the now and the not yet.

In addition to being a season of anticipation Advent is a season for *longing*. In this sense, we are longing for the coming of Jesus into our personal lives, our community, our nation, and into the world. It is not as though Jesus isn't among us now, because he is. The question is whether we can truly feel his presence.

Have you been so distracted lately that you cannot feel the hand of the Lord in your life? If you have, Advent is the time to redirect your attention. It is the time to pay attention to the signs of Christ in your midst.

Jesus understood that many of us suffer from a form of spiritual Attention Deficit Disorder when it comes to keeping our eyes on him. He so appreciated this weakness that he was constantly calling his followers and detractors to pay attention. Though he may never have actually said "Pay attention," he did say "Look!" quite a bit. "Look at the birds of the air . . ." (Matt: 6:26); "Look at the fig tree and all the trees. . . ." (Luke 21:29). When Jesus said "look," he was saying "Pay attention!" He is telling us the same thing today, to focus our time and energy on the essential things of life. These essential things include the love that God has for us, the love we should have for each other, our prayer and worship life, the wonders of creation, and attending to the needs of those around us. He knew we would feel his presence by paying attention to these essential things.

This Advent look for the presence of the Lord in your life. Look for him in the Bible, in your personal and corporate worship, in your relationships, in your workplace, and in the beauty of creation. If distracted, try to get refocused as quickly as possible. Simply say, "Come, Lord Jesus," and then look. May your longing for Christ be satisfied when you look again and experience his presence.
