Message From Thack

Our Capital Campaign: Caring for What God Has Entrusted to Us

Last Sunday, August 9, we officially began our Capital Campaign to raise \$200,000 for deferred maintenance and needed repairs to our parish buildings and grounds. The campaign will continue through **Sunday, September 13**.

I want to reiterate an important point about this campaign. **This is not our annual stewardship campaign.** Our annual stewardship commitment provides the financial resources necessary for the ongoing ministry and operation of St. Paul's. We continue to need the annual contributions of our faithful parishioners to the General Fund to pay our regular operating expenses and support the ministries through which St. Paul's serves God and our community. Our Every Member Canvas Stewardship Drive is in late October in conjunction with Rally Day.

The current Capital Campaign is different. It is a **one-time request**, above and beyond our regular giving, to address deferred maintenance and repairs that have accumulated around our church campus. The money contributed to this campaign will be used **exclusively for these maintenance projects** and not for the ordinary operating expenses of the parish.

On **Sunday, August 16**, Joe Cook will share with the congregation more information about the specific maintenance issues we need to address. These are projects that can no longer be postponed. Caring for them now will help prevent further deterioration, protect our buildings, and avoid potentially greater expenses in the future.

I hope we will see this campaign as something more than a to do list of gutters, bricks, stucco, paint, drainage issues, and repairs. This Capital Campaign is also a spiritual matter.

Christian stewardship is about much more than money. Stewardship is our faithful response to everything God has entrusted to our care. Our buildings and grounds are among those gifts. Generations of faithful people before us sacrificed to build, maintain, and preserve our church property so that there would be a place where people could worship God, hear the Gospel, receive the Sacraments, educate their children in the faith, and grow together as the Body of Christ. We have inherited the objects of their faithful stewardship. Now it is our turn.

As I mentioned in my sermon last Sunday, the buildings themselves are not the Church. We are the Church. But these buildings are tools of our ministry. Week after week, they provide the sacred and practical spaces in which that ministry takes place. Caring for them is therefore

not simply a matter of property management. It is part of caring for the ministry God has entrusted to us and preserving it for those who will come after us.

Jesus reminds us, “From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required” (Luke 12:48). God has blessed St. Paul’s abundantly. With that blessing comes the responsibility to care faithfully for what we have received.

I hope every household at St. Paul’s will prayerfully consider participating in this campaign according to its ability. No gift is insignificant when it is offered faithfully and gratefully. Our goal is \$200,000, but behind that number is something much more important: a parish community accepting responsibility for the gifts God has placed in our hands.

You may contribute to the Capital Campaign at any time between now and **Sunday, September 13**, by making your check payable to **St. Paul’s Episcopal Church** and writing **“Capital Campaign”** on the memo line.

Thank you for your generosity, your faithfulness, and your commitment to the ministry of St. Paul’s. May we continue to be good stewards of what God has entrusted to us, not simply for ourselves, but for those who will encounter Christ here for generations to come.

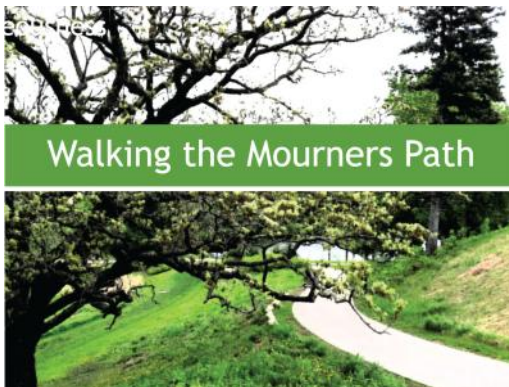

Excerpt from Burial II

BCP, p. 492

O worthy and eternal Judge, do not let the pains of death turn us away from you at our last hour.

Recently a much-loved, vibrant, conservationist, newly-minted priest, and a truly holy man of God died. His death caused many people to ask themselves where was God in this? I believe Rabbi Harold Kushner, in discussing Job's trials, gives us a glimpse.

Kushner says, "There is only one question which really matters: why do bad things happen to good people?" He questions the belief that God is all-powerful. Job asks, "God, why are you doing this to me?" Kushner suggests we say instead: "God, look what is happening here. Can you help me?" We turn to God, not for answers to "why," because, honestly, we will never know. Rather, we turn to God for strength and for comfort.

Kushner puts it beautifully:

We can maintain our own self-respect and sense of goodness without having to feel that God has judged us and condemned us. We can be angry at what has happened..., without feeling that we are angry at God. More than that, we can recognize our anger at life's unfairness, our instinctive compassion at seeing people suffer, as coming from God who teaches us to be angry at injustice and to feel compassion for the afflicted. Instead of feeling that we are opposed to God, we can feel that our indignation is God's anger at unfairness working through us, that when we cry out, we are still on God's side, and He is still on ours.

It was a wonderful ending to a very special afternoon, and everyone went home with a smile—and a lovely gift.

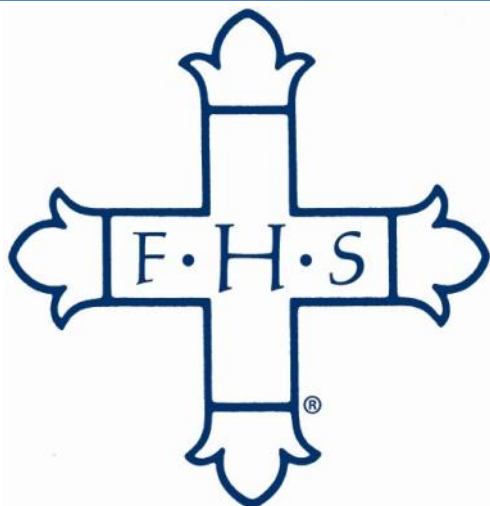
