Message from Thack

From time to time I visit the Garden of the Resurrection and meditate. Before I leave I'll usually read the names of the folks who share that holy space. I knew most of them and memories of our time together wash over me.

In these moments I remember sharing the Eucharist with them, praying with and for them, and presiding at their celebration of life services. I recall the happier times of our relationship when we fellowshiped together, shared a meal or a cup of coffee. I even remember with fondness when we got into spirited debates about theology, politics, and the social order.

In my musings I am always reminded of how fleeting life is and how much I miss them. Life is so fragile.

It calls to mind our Ash Wednesday service. When I impose the ashes I say, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." (*BCP*, p. 265). These familiar words from our Ash Wednesday liturgy remind us of our mortal nature. Like our friends interned in the Garden of the Resurrection, one day we will all be reduced to dust.

To some, the subject of death is morbid and they do not relish thinking about it. While I can understand this, the fact remains that physical death awaits all of us. For this reason, you would be giving your loved ones a gift by putting your affairs in order now. This includes the practical affairs such as updating your wills, preparing advance directives and durable powers of attorney, estate planning, end of life arrangements with the funeral home, and meeting with me to plan your celebration of life service.

Then there are the "spiritual" affairs that also need to be considered in anticipation of death. These affairs need to be put in order before we leave this mortal coil. To this end, have you engaged in self-examination and repentance for past sins? Are you reconciled with those you are at odds with? Are you reading and reflecting on God's holy word, receiving the sacraments, and sharing your time, talents, and treasures with God's church? All of these things are necessary "affairs" that need to be resolved before we die.

If you find end of life planning difficult to consider, then think what it would be like if you were presented to God tomorrow. Would you be prepared? Author Robert Fulghum describes his ritual of going out to his cemetery plot on his birthday to sit for a while in a lawn chair and think about the day he will come face to face with our Creator. From this perspective he quickly sees what is vital and worthwhile in life and what is not.

I'm not suggesting that you pack a lunch and trek to the cemetery as part of your end of life preparations. However, reflecting on our last days can be both cathartic and a good discipline. Rather than being a morbid exercise, it can help us anticipate our union with God and cause us to focus on what needs to be resolved in this life before that heavenly encounter. It can be a time of dispensing with unresolved sins, as well as the unnecessary habits and things of this life. To practice such a discipline could also be a source of renewal in the present.

Look for changes in October!

For those who have not returned to our live services, please know some changes will be happening beginning in October. For starters, we will be permitted to accommodate up to 100 people at each of our Sunday services. This will allow social distancing and ensure the safety of our congregants. In fact, Donna Nolte, who is the Director of Nursing at Thomas Hospital, a member of our vestry and our Parish Nurse, said attending worship at St. Paul’s is safer than shopping in Publix.

Adult Sunday School will resume in Malone Hall that Sunday at 9:15 a.m. Coffee hour will meet in the parish courtyard (with proper social distancing). Our Great Wednesday @ 6:00 program will resume on Wednesday, October 7. We will continue our study of *Just Mercy* beginning where we left off at the start of the Covid-19 shutdown. Food will be served cafeteria style so as to minimize possible contamination.

If you are not immunocompromised, I hope you will consider joining us for worship and fellowship on Sunday, October 4. Please know you have been missed! Thack

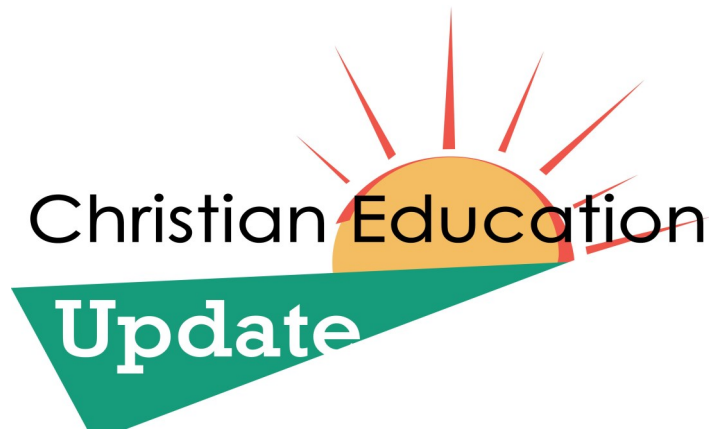
