## Message From Thack

Yesterday during our services, we had the privilege of recognizing and celebrating our graduating seniors from both high school and college. One by one, they stood before the congregation and shared their hopes and dreams for the future, and heartfelt reflections about how much their families and St. Paul's have meant to them throughout their lives.

As I looked across the congregation, I noticed many of you wiping away tears. Some of those tears came from pride. Some came from gratitude. And some came from the realization that the children we once baptized, taught in Sunday school, confirmed, and watched grow up before our very eyes are now stepping into entirely new chapters of life. It was a holy reminder that life is always moving through seasons of transition.

Spring in the life of the Church often carries with it the sound of change. Caps and gowns appear, graduation announcements arrive in the mail, and parents quietly and anxiously wonder how the home will be without the presence of a child who is about to leave. This season reminds us that life is always moving, always changing, always calling us into something new. As Ecclesiastes reminds us, "For everything there is a season."

For our graduates, this is one of the great transitions of life. High school and college graduations mark the end of one chapter and the uncertain beginning of another. Some of our young people will leave home for college, others will begin careers, military service, or new vocational paths. Childhood dependence slowly gives way to adulthood, responsibility, independence, and discovery. It is an exciting season, but it can also be unsettling. The future often arrives like an unopened letter: full of promise, but still unknown.

Yet this transition does not belong only to graduates. Their parents are also entering a new season. For years, life has revolved around schedules, school events, sports practices, late-night conversations, and the daily rhythms of family life. Now comes the difficult and holy task of letting go just enough for children to grow into the people God is calling them to become. There is joy in this season, but there is also tenderness and adjustment. Every loving parent understands that transitions can tug at the heart.

The truth is that graduation season simply makes visible something all of us experience throughout life: we are always moving through transitions. Illness changes us. Retirement changes us. Relationships, losses, new opportunities, disappointments, and unexpected blessings all carry us from one season into another. Much of life is spent learning how to navigate these changing tides with faith and courage.

In the Acts of the Apostles, the disciples found themselves in exactly such a moment. Jesus had ascended into heaven, and the disciples stood staring upward, uncertain about what would happen next. Their teacher, guide, and friend was no longer physically beside them. They had entered a season between what had been and what was still to come.

What did they do in that uncertain space? They prayed. They stayed together. And they lived with hope in the promise that God was not finished with them yet.

That may be the great lesson transitions teach us. We rarely get to see the entire road ahead. Instead, God asks us to walk forward with trust. The graduates among us may not yet know exactly where life will lead. Parents may wonder what this next chapter will feel like. Many others in our parish are facing transitions of their own, some joyful and some difficult. Yet in every season, God remains faithful.

Try to remember that transitions are not simply endings. They are often the birthplace of new beginnings.

As a parish family, we celebrate our graduates with great pride and affection. We give thanks for all they have accomplished, for the people they are becoming, and for the ways this church has helped shape their lives. We also pray for their parents and families as they navigate this sacred season of change.

May all of us remember that even in uncertain times, God continues to lead us forward with grace, hope, and purpose. The seasons change, but the presence of God remains steadfast through them all.

**Transitions Prayer:**

Gracious and loving God, we commend to your care our graduates as they step into new seasons of life, new schools, new cities, and new beginnings. Go before them in every unfamiliar place. When they feel excited, steady them with wisdom. When they feel lonely, surround them with your abiding presence. Remind them that there is no road they travel where you are not already waiting for them.

Give peace also to those who remain behind: parents, grandparents, families, and friends whose hearts are stretched by love and distance. In this holy season of transition, bind us together across every mile with your grace, your protection, and your unending love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

## !!Attention St. Paul's Parishioners and Ministry Leaders!!

Summer is quickly approaching and that means VBS will be here soon! I am in the planning phase right now and can see that this VBS is going to need a lot of hands to make everything possible! I want to encourage you to share your God given gifts and talents, along with our many ministries for help with oversight of each station, and ask that you pray about helping with specific stations or tasks leading up to VBS to give us a smoother and less hectic VBS experience.

I need specifically:

- A drama coach to help teach morning opening skits. This would include meeting maybe on Sunday mornings, or Sunday afternoons to teach youth helpers (3rd grade-High School) the skits for openings or closings and also working with them on the songs. You could create your own schedule to pull this team (formerly known as Music Arts and Drama Camp) together. I have the skits, but you can be creative too!
- A snack director to come up with a themed snack each day, and collaborate with me on decorating Malone Hall the days before VBS. Snack suggestions are included in our kit! We can use them, or you can be creative!
- Music Leader for opening and closing each day. Can work alongside the drama coach to encourage youth to participate with songs and learn the motions to encourage our little ones to sing and dance along! I would like to showcase a song or 2 at the 8:00 and 10:30 services the Sunday before or after VBS this year.
- A Bible Adventures Director decorates and pulls together all of the necessary items for all 4 days of Bible Adventures (in Children's Chapel). Will also be in charge of decorating and doing changes for each day of Bible Adventures. Most decorations we already have, it is just coordinating and setting up for each day. This station also needs an assistant some days to dress as a character or be a helping hand for Father Thack.
- A Sticky Scripture is a video-led station that helps the kids learn the Bible verse each day. It is usually held in Malone Hall when we are not having snack. The kids have little booklets and get a figurine each day that goes along with the theme and Bible Verse of the Day.
- A Nursery Worker who will help with the little ones (ages 2 and under) in the Preschool from 8:30-12pm.
- We also need group leaders to walk around with the kids, week of (we try for 1 adult per group with 2-3 middle and high school assistants) and will be leading small groups too. I will provide all information to group leaders well in advance if I have volunteer sign ups!

We will have a Volunteer meeting scheduled soon! If you are interested in possibly serving for one of these needs, please let me know! I will be happy to give you more details and share curriculum, etc. with you!

Please pray about taking on one of these stations (you can even take on a station with others) to minister to our little ones! It's a busy and exhausting, but wonderful week and I think we can make this one the best VBS yet, together!

Our VBS is June 29- July 2, 9am-12pm this year, and our set up days will be June 22-26.

## **Education for Ministry Program Update**

Education for Ministry (EfM) classes have wrapped up for another year. We have many participants moving on to the next year of the curriculum. Congratulations to Barbara Brousseau, Meredith Portman, Robin Dilsaver, Crystal Anderson, Sue Cody, Rhonda Jones, Melanie Davis, Gaye Wilson, and Diana Spillman for completing Year 2 – The New Testament and Mary Mullins Reddit (St. James, Fairhope) for completing Year 1 – The Old Testament. Looking ahead to our next year, starting in August 2026, we will have room for five additional participants. If you previously attended EfM but did not finish, we would be glad to welcome you back! If you are ready to join the program, reach out to me, or Terri. The curriculum was recently revised, and the reading for Year 1 – The Old Testament has been pared down. The interlude books and essays we read this year were excellent.

For those wondering, what is EfM? It is a small group class that meets once a week, in the evening (usually 6 pm – 8 pm on Mondays) following a traditional school calendar for a total of 36 weeks, and for four years. Classes are held August through May. Classes are limited to about 15 participants and are led by mentors that have completed the four-year program. The curriculum is designed by the School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee. This is not training to become a priest, but a class to explore the Old Testament (class year 1), the New Testament (class year 2), the history of Christianity (class year 3), and Theology (class year 4). There are year-specific assigned readings, and a few times a year, the entire class is assigned the same reading. Discussions are about the readings, we conduct theological reflections, and we share our faith journeys.

The class costs \$350 per year. This includes class supplies provided by Sewanee, textbooks, and workbooks. We can offer 1-2 reduced fee scholarships. We no longer bring an organized meal to share; we have snacks available and participants are encouraged to bring their own food for supper as needed.

Here is some additional EfM background information from the Sewanee website:

EfM lives in the School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee. It is a unique four-year small-group formation program based on study and practice in theological reflection. Since its founding in 1975, this international program has assisted more than 120,000 participants discover and nurture their call to Christian service where they live, work, and play. EfM helps the faithful discover the Christian tradition, bringing it into conversation with their experiences of the world.

Many people have been taught that one must be ordained to be a minister, but our vows at baptism say something different: that all baptized Christians are ministers. God calls us to be active participants in ministry. What is that ministry? As the Church, we are called to continue the ministry of Jesus. We are called to be the hands, heart, and incarnate body of Christ in our own place through worship, reflection, in service to others, and by the proclamation of God's Word to all people.

The EfM program is designed to help Christians prepare for their ministry. It is that vocation for which we pray at the end of the communion service: "And now, send us out to do the work you have given us to do, to love and serve you as faithful witnesses of Christ our Lord."

During the service of Confirmation, we ask God to "Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at Baptism. Send them forth in the power of the Spirit to perform the service you set before them." EfM offers an opportunity to discover how to respond to the call to a Christian life.
