#### **Message From Thack**

A Life of Quiet Devotion: Celebrating the Life and Ministry of Sally Boom

Our beloved Sally Boom just celebrated her 95th birthday, marking not only a long life but a truly remarkable legacy of devotion and service to the Episcopal Church. For over eight decades, Sally has lived out her baptismal promises with grace and humility, dedicating her life to the quiet, faithful work that upholds and beautifies the Church's worship. Her legacy is one of reverence, craftsmanship, and deep spiritual commitment—an offering of love that has touched countless lives.

Born in Oakland, California on July 15, 1930, Sally Boom was baptized as an infant into the Episcopal Church and never strayed far from the sacred spaces that shaped her life. From the very beginning, Sally was drawn not to the spotlight, but to the quiet, faithful work of preparation and care—the hidden ministry that makes worship possible for all.

At just eleven years old, Sally began serving on the Altar Guild, a ministry she would dedicate the rest of her life to. Week after week, year after year, she lovingly polished sacred vessels, tended to candlesticks, cleaned and ironed fair linens, corporals and purificators, and ensured that every corner of the altar reflected the reverence due to God. Her hands, consecrated by years of service, became instruments of both grace and beauty.

But Sally's gifts went beyond the practical. She was also an artist of devotion, hand-stitching kneelers that bore both her skill and her prayers—small masterpieces of love and tradition that now cushion the knees of generations. Each thread was an act of quiet worship, a testimony to a heart rooted in service.

Sally's ministry was never loud or self-promoting. She did not seek recognition. In fact, many of those who came to worship never knew of her service. Yet literally thousands of worshippers were blessed by her behind-the-scenes offerings. The altar was ready, the candles trimmed, the linens pristine—because Sally and the guild were always there, quietly serving our Lord. Her example taught that calling does not always come with a pulpit, a collar, or a title. Sometimes, it comes with a silver and brass polishing cloth, a needle and thread, and a heart wholly given to God.

Over the years, Sally was not only a faithful servant, but also a mentor and inspiration to many across the Episcopal Church. Once while I was serving as the Chaplain to the Province IV Altar Guild Conference at Kanuga in Hendersonville, North Carolina, we visited a nearby historic Episcopal Church and admired the exquisitely hand stitched altar rail kneelers. Our host explained, "Sally Boom traveled from Alabama and graciously shared her expertise with about a dozen of us and this is the fruit of her instruction." I proudly told her, "Sally is one of my parishioners," and shared how she inspired the creation of our kneelers at St. Paul's.

As we celebrate Sally's life and ministry, we give thanks for her unwavering faithfulness—and for the quiet legacy of beauty, order, and reverence she leaves behind at the altar of the Lord. Happy Birthday Sally and well done, good and faithful servant.

#### St. Paul's Thrift Shop Celebrates 48 Years!

St. Paul's Thrift Shop was founded in 1977 by a group of dedicated St. Paul's ladies with the intent of raising funds for our church. Our founders included Jo Alves, Rennie Pittman, Jean Yancey, Margaret Waller, Rochelle Robinson, Airrior Norwood and Avos Stickney.

They rented the "Old Methodist Church" in Daphne (now the Daphne Museum) then cleaned out their own homes and attics to find items with which to stock the shop. On July 7, 1977, St. Paul's Thrift Shop opened their doors to the public and began accepting donations. Rochelle Robinson once said donors even brought old overalls and boots, still dirty from the field, so the volunteers took donations home to wash and repair them and Margaret Waller said many times that it was a great day if they made over a dollar that first year!

In the 1980's, the shop was relocated to Main St. near Manci's then, in 2002, the Thrift Shop came home to the church campus with the construction of our current building. As we grew, the shop was expanded in 2009 and again in 2020 when the furniture room was added.

During our first 20 years, the shop's profits were donated exclusively to the church but that changed in 1997 when the by-laws were amended to read that 75% of the profit each year will be donated but split equally between the church and Baldwin County community service agencies which are chosen by the Board of Directors. The remaining 25% stays in the bank as an operating fund. Since 1997, about 2 million dollars have been donated which is over and above the shop's regular monthly contributions to the church.

In May of 2025, the Thrift Shop sent out checks to The Alabama Free Clinic, Alabama Sheriff's Boys Ranch, Anchor Cross Cancer Foundation, Baldwin County Angels, Baldwin Family Village Foundation, Care House, Camp Beckwith, Daphne Volunteer Fire Dept., Neighborhood Bridges, North Baldwin Animal Shelter, Prodisee Pantry, Seaglass Initiative, Spanish Fort Volunteer Fire Dept., St. Paul's Episcopal Church Preschool, St. Paul's Mission Trip to the Dominican Republic, The Dream Center, The Exceptional Foundation, The Lighthouse, The Shoulder for Men, The Shoulder for Women, Under His Wings, William Green Veterans Home, Willow Farms Equine Rescue, Wilmer Hall Children's Home, Women's Care Medical Center and The Women's Health Center.

All of us at St. Paul's Thrift Shop wish to thank our many donors, customers, volunteers, staff and clergy who make these annual gifts possible. And, we invite YOU to help in this ministry. #### THANK YOU TO OUR ST. PAUL'S SAINTS!

Dear Saint Paul's Family,

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude for the incredible support we've received from our vestry and the St. Paul's Men's Group, which has been instrumental in making much-needed improvements to our preschool building and playground.

Back in 2017, we faced the difficult decision to demolish our old wooden playground structures due to termite damage and aging. Thanks to the hard work and generosity of our preschool community, we were able to raise significant funds, and the Men's Group took on the mighty task of overseeing the entire building project and the completion of our loan payoff for the new playground equipment. This was truly a huge blessing to us!

Unfortunately, with the new playground came new challenges. Our building has faced repeated issues with rainwater flooding our main room due to water running down the hill. The St. Paul's Men's Group came to our rescue once again by digging a drainage ditch around the back to channel the floodwaters away—a daunting yet necessary task! We've also faced plumbing issues, including overflowing toilets (thankfully with clean water) impacting our main room and Super Stars classroom. Their continued support has made a world of difference.

In the fall, one of our own saints graciously funded new toilets, which significantly alleviated our flooding woes. Others contributed by providing improved lighting throughout our building, with one saint dedicating his time to replace every single light ballast in our building! Over the summer, the Men's Group arranged for professional floor waxing, enhancing the overall cleanliness and appearance of our floors. They also tackled drainage issues once more by re-digging ditches and leveling and sodding the playground area—the main culprit behind our flooding concerns.

We feel blessed beyond words by the generosity and dedication of our St. Paul's Saints. With these improvements, the possibilities for utilizing our space endless as we enter our 30<sup>th</sup> year of operation. Our new grassy space will be utilized for soccer classes and picnics for our preschoolers, outdoor movie nights, and so much more! We can hardly wait to see what the future holds.

While our old building will always be a work in progress, we are committed to offering the best possible experience for our upcoming 30<sup>th</sup> school year. We look forward to welcoming parents to see the improvements made and to providing a nurturing environment where our little ones can continue to learn and grow within our enhanced walls.




