A Message From Thack

I hope this letter finds you well and that you are experiencing God's blessings in your life. I have greatly missed you during the Pandemic and look forward to the day we can worship and fellowship together again.

It is an understatement to suggest this has been a strange and difficult year for everyone. Between the Covid-19 pandemic, contentious 2020 national and local elections, Hurricane Sally and having to wear masks and practice social distancing, I am ready for 2021 to arrive! I could never have imagined the surreal world in which we now live.

That said, one of the few constants in my life, besides God, my family and friends has been St. Paul's Church. It has been my safe harbor during this storm. In fact, other than three days immediately after Hurricane Sally, St. Paul's has not missed a beat since the beginning of the pandemic. We've not only continued our usual worship schedule, we've been offering Morning Prayer and Compline services online for six days a week. Terri, Joan, Elizabeth, Tina, John, Christopher, David, Judith, Fletcher and I have worked non-stop to keep the ministries and services going in order to keep you connected to St. Paul's during the shutdown. We've faithfully attended to our ministries so you were not bereft of your worship community during the Covid-19 crisis.

Besides our many worship opportunities, Christian education for youth and adults has continued unabated, Tina and St. Paul's Youth have continued to meet for spiritual formation and fellowship; the "Corona-Choir" has continued to meet on Wednesday nights to practice and record music for Sunday worship; the Altar and Flower Guilds have continued to prepare for our worship services; ushers, lectors, acolytes, vergers attend live worship; and the Men's Group has been meeting and prepared Sunday breakfast for the parish on October 4 and will have a parish fish fry on Rally Day on October 25. Finally, the Thrift Shop has been open for business since June and completed the beautiful addition to the building in July. In short, St. Paul's has not only weathered the pandemic, it has increased its ministries and activities.

We have great worship, Christian education, outreach and fellowship, despite the pandemic, because of the faithful staff and members who generously offer their time, talent and gifts to support these programs and activities. I am grateful to the staff, Vestry and all of you who resolved to pull together during this difficult time to continue to keep St. Paul's a holy, welcoming and mission minded community in this Covid-19 world. I am also grateful to the saints who have gone before us whose gifts of time, talent and resources helped to build our parish campus and buildings so that our ministries may be accomplished. They were those who pledged, and in many cases tithed to St. Paul's over the years so there would be a vital parish for future generations. We are the direct beneficiaries of their generosity.

This brings me to the point of this letter. Many of you have been faithful by giving your time, talent and resources despite the Covid-19 restrictions. Thank you for your faithfulness. However, we cannot continue to operate without the help of the entire congregation.

First, pledging in 2020 is off by a significant amount. Currently, we are \$ 97,988.42 behind in pledges for our Operating Fund. This is the fund that pays the bills, salaries and insurance deductibles on our facilities. We are also \$ 46,174.00 behind in our Building Fund pledges for the year. We cannot operate very long with such deficits. Additionally, many of you do not pledge but have faithfully put your gifts in the offering plates over the years. We count on that revenue as well to sustain our ministries. With so many of you not attending live worship at present, that revenue is lost.

If you pledged to the Operating Fund in 2020, please catch your pledge up as soon as you can. If you don't pledge but have traditionally made plate offerings, you can do so online. Please call Terri in the church office if you need assistance in doing this.

Also, we are now receiving pledges for 2021. Our hope is to have the 2021 pledges turned in by Rally Day which is Sunday, October 25, 2020. We will need to prepare our 2021 budget in early November so it's important to turn in your pledges by October 25. If you do give but don't traditionally make a pledge, please consider pledging this year. This helps us to more accurately plan our budget.

October 25th is also our community ministry fair. Enclosed is a list of our ministries. We will post the ministry offerings online next week. We will also advertise in person and online on Rally Day to help you to decide which ministries you would like to participate in. This is your opportunity to offer your time and talents to the glory of God.

It is now up to all of us to step up and resume our place in St. Paul's to ensure that future generations will also benefit from the ministries that St. Paul's supports. This can only happen if *everyone* is pulling the wagon and supporting the parish through the gifts of their time, talent and treasure.

Enclosed is your Annual Giving Card. Before filling it out, please prayerfully consider your many blessings from God, especially those through your relationship with St. Paul's parish. After prayerful reflection, please fill the card out and either mail it or drop it off at the parish office. You can also place it in the offering plate on Sunday. Even if you choose not to give, please mark \$0 on the card so we will not send a second notice.
