Message from Thack

Happy Epiphany Season! The season of Epiphany lasts from four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (Jan. 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. Our season will last eight weeks this year. The length of the season varies according to the date of Easter (April 17, 2022).

The gospel stories of this season describe various events that manifest the divinity of Jesus. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the first Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the wedding at Cana, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ. We are called to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity.

The Incarnation—God with us in the flesh—transforms every aspect of our human experience into a place of encounter with the Holy One. To have these experiences requires us to be present to every moment we can. That's why a seminary professor once said, "This is the season of paying attention."

That said, should we take this season in the Church year seriously? I ask that because some people find themselves in an emotional slump after the intense waiting of Advent, which culminates with Christmas, and then is followed immediately by celebrations associated with the chronological New Year. This let-down is understandable given the fast pace of the holidays. It can feel like everything we looked forward to is now behind us and all that lies ahead is getting back to work.

This year, it's still hard to know what to feel. Most of us are grateful to have left 2021 behind but we are still in the midst of the pandemic. The Omicron variant is the mutation du jour and as this virus mutates it will most likely be something else in a couple of months. The specter of the coronavirus is ever present and will probably be a part of our existence long after 2022.

Even so, the celebration of Epiphany is important with its emphasis on how God reveals the mystery of God's divine presence in the midst of our ordinary lives. So yes, we should take the season of Epiphany seriously. Take advantage of this season to deepen your awareness of God's presence and pray to God daily that you don't miss out on anything, especially close encounters with the Divine.

Confirmation Classes

Adult and Youth Confirmation classes will begin in a couple of weeks. Confirmation is the sacramental rite in which the candidates “express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop” (BCP, p. 860). Those who were baptized at an early age and those baptized as adults without laying on of hands by a bishop are expected to make a mature public affirmation of their faith, recommit themselves to the responsibilities of their baptism, and receive laying on of hands by a bishop (BCP, p. 412). Adults baptized with the laying on of hands by a bishop are considered to be confirmed.

The Prayer Book rite for Confirmation includes forms for Reception and the Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows. Those who have already made a mature Christian commitment in the ELCA Lutheran, Roman Catholic and Orthodox traditions are recognized as members of the one holy catholic and apostolic church, and received into the fellowship of the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion. Those who have returned from a time of religious inactivity to an active practice of faith may publicly reaffirm their baptismal vows. Others who have experienced a renewal of faith or desire to renew their Christian commitment may also reaffirm their baptismal vows. Reaffirmation may be repeated, depending on the pastoral needs of the person.

Youth Confirmation classes will begin on Tuesday, January 25 at 4:00 p.m. in Malone Hall. These classes will be held on Tuesday afternoons through April 5, 2022. Adult Confirmation classes will begin on Sunday January 23 at 2:00 p.m. in Malone Hall and run through April 3, 2022. Bishop Russell’s annual visitation will be on Sunday, April 24, 2022, and he will conduct Confirmations, Receptions, and Reaffirmations that morning during the 10:30 a.m. service.

If you and/or your child would like to be Confirmed, Received or you would like to Reaffirm your baptismal vows on April 24, please contact the church office and register for the classes. Please call Terri McMillan at 251-626-2421 to reserve a place in the classes. The subjects to be presented at these classes will include the Anglican Way of Christianity, the Sacraments and Sacramental Rites, Church History, *Book of Common Prayer* and Church hymnody, Church Calendar and Liturgical Year, Holy Scripture, Creeds, Vocation, and Church Etiquette.

Please know anyone may attend these classes even if they have been Confirmed. Regardless of status, everyone must preregister in advance to insure we order enough study materials. Thack

Tracts Talk! Writing for Spiritual Growth

This tract, ***Writing for Spiritual Growth***, is written by a man who knows his stuff - our own Dick Schmidt, who is an exceptional writer. But don't let that intimidate you. After a brief introduction, the pamphlet describes a number of methods and reasons for spiritual writing: journaling, writing with scripture, spiritual autobiography, and writing to find your way. It also lists some helpful tools and techniques.

I've heard it said that "singing is praying twice," and I would add that writing is praying twice. When you are asked to pray in public, you are praying for God to hear and for those listening to hear. When you are praying in private, it's just between you and God. The same is true for writing: you may write for an audience, or just for you and God. Whether you're a good writer or not really doesn't matter at all, especially if it's just between you and God. It's a way of articulating your thoughts, and it helps you focus. You can just jot down thoughts as they come to you, and by writing them, you can go back and look at them, and maybe expand on them - or not, as it suits your needs.

Grab your favorite pen, pencil, or *colored pencil!*, a notebook or just a piece of paper, or even your phone, tablet or laptop, and give it a whirl!
